# Marion County Radio Communications Project - Phase 1 Update

#### Summary of presentation:

- Before the board is a draft version of the contract;
- Following up from a Work Session in October 2019, for the radio project for the county;
- In October 2019, Public Works issued a Request for Proposals:
  - In December 2019, selected ADCOMM Engineering, LLC as the radio consultant; and
  - Public Works will work on the scope and strategy with the consulting firm
- The contract will come before the board in a few weeks for approval;
- The board gave the approval to move forward with an IIP for \$280,000 for the project;
- The contract is for \$523,300 due to the fact that it will cover the Public Works UHF and the Sheriff's Office VHF radios:
  - o There are more sites and analysis that will need to be done; and
  - o Potentially a unified system that the county can leverage multiple sources of funding to maintain that system.
- More than half of the scope of work contains contingency items.

### **Board discussion:**

- The total price of the project, with all three phases is \$3 million;
- The radio system is a digital truncated system, which will meet every way that public safety radio network can be compliant;
- The county's primary partner is METCOM, and they are satisfied with the simulcast system they have;
- There are 21 agencies that would need to buy-in to a new system;

- There is some 9-1-1 funding for this project;
- Currently there are no Intergovernmental Agreements with the radio systems in place now;
- The Sheriff's Office current infrastructure is very close to being obsolete;
- There are seven radio towers that the county uses:
  - o The county owns three; and
  - o METCOM owns four.
- There are seven satellite repeaters in the area; and
- There are three or four radio towers that are needed to cover the dead areas around the county.

## Discuss Purchasing Mobile Radios for Sheriff's Office Vehicles

## Summary of presentation:

- The county patrol cars are outfitted with a dual deck radio system, UHF and VHF, in order to talk with multiple agencies around the county;
- The City of Salem switched over to their new radio system;
- The City of Salem will turn off their old system in the fall of 2020;
- The most economical option the county has found to maintain connectivity with the city is to add a tri-deck radio system;
- Public Works identified 99 patrol vehicles needing radio upgrades;
- The county is looking for an intermediate solution that works;
- Because of the pandemic, all radios are on backorder; and
- Staff recommends making the entire purchase at once in order to get into the backorder queue.

### **Board discussion:**

- There is money in Networking Capital to cover the cost of the radios;
- There is also an option to add the cost into the third supplemental budget;
- The Sheriff's Office is waiting on the recommendation from ADCOMM for the portable radios; and
- The jail radio project will be finished by June 30, 2020.

## **Review Buena Vista Ferry Operating Hours**

### Summary of presentation:

- Due to COVID-19, ridership has dropped dramatically;
- Wheatland Ferry has 80 percent ridership;
- Buena Vista Ferry has 17 percent ridership:
  - o It is on a 12-hour schedule, 7:00 a.m. 7:00 p.m.;
  - o The ferry operates with 21 hours of overtime a month;
  - o Staff is proposing to operate the ferry from 8:30 a.m. 5:30 p.m.;
  - o Would eliminate impact of overtime; and
  - o The ferry averages 100 cars a day.

#### **Board discussion:**

• The commissioners approve changing the operating time for the ferry, but would like to revisit it when the pandemic is over:

- o The commissioners would like the ferry to operate until 6:00 p.m. to give people getting off work the opportunity to get to the ferry in time.
- Public Works is providing the public two weeks' notice of the schedule change.

## COVID-19 Update:

# Summary of presentation:

- County Grant Program for Small Businesses:
  - There are 636 applications entered into the system;
  - There have been 377 checks sent out;
  - o There are 101 checks ready to go out today;
  - o There are 150 incomplete applications left to go through:
    - Community Services will be verifying each of them one-by-one.
- The City of Keizer voted to dedicate community prosperity funds awarded by Marion County to the sole purpose of making the money available to small Keizer businesses:
  - o There are 18 businesses that will be awarded \$2,500.
- The county is releasing positive COVID-19 cases by the zip code; and
- The Oregon Health Authority will be releasing COVID-19 recovery data at the county level.

## COMMISSIONERS' COMMITTEE ASSIGNMENTS AND UPDATE:

#### Sam Brentano:

- Would like to propose the county to take back the management of the forests under the lawsuit:
  - Proposing setting up regions for several counties to oversee sections of the forest lands; and
  - o Hiring managers to oversee fire suppression:
    - Harvesting.

#### Kevin Cameron:

 Would like to work with Polk County to set up a framework with reopening the county.
