ATTENDANCE:

Jan Fritz called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m.

INFORMATIONAL:

Discuss Proposal to Install All-Way Stop Control at the River Road NE, Quinaby Road NE, and Clear Lake Road NE Intersection

Summary of presentation:

- Public Works has met with the board in the past regarding this intersection;
- This intersection has the highest intersection crash rate in the whole county;
- The Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) has an All Roads Transportation Safety (ARTS) Grant Program:
 - They look at all of the crashes statewide and identify hot spots and systemic crash issues or locations;
 - o ODOT identifies those areas for the counties:
 - Counties develop recommended counter-measures;
 - Identify benefit to cost ratios; and
 - Apply for grant funding based on the data.
- This intersection has been on the ARTS list in the past;
- In the last five years, there have been 40 crashes total:
 - Two fatalities in the last six years.
- More than 70 percent of the crashes have been related to cars on the minor streets misjudging the gaps in traffic, or failure to stop at the stop sign:
 - o Ten percent of the crashes are from people turning left onto River Road that are misjudging gaps and being hit by oncoming traffic.
- This intersection is a two-way stopped controlled intersection;
- There is a significant skew with River Road oriented in a northeast/southwest direction and a two-way stop control with the side streets Quinaby Road and Clear Lake Road;
- The crash patterns are supportive of an all-way stop;
- In previous studies, all-way stops have been shown to be very effective in reducing crashes;
- It will be more effective in this intersection because of the skew and visibility issues;

- Public Works is proposing the following:
 - Install stop signs at the north and south River Road intersections with four red solar powered beacons on each of the stop signs in the intersection;
 - A "Stop Ahead" sign in each direction;
 - Amber beacons at the new stop signs;
 - o Install "New Traffic Pattern Ahead" signs for six months;
 - Set out portable message signs on River Road for the northbound and southbound traffic; and
 - Improving channelization at the corner of Quinaby Road and River Road.

Board discussion:

- This intersection should operate successfully for the next seven years;
- Signaling the intersection will be the next phase, but it is not necessary at this time:
- There are more than 6,000 cars a day that use River Road;
- If Public Works were to signalize the intersection, it would be more beneficial to realign it so turning lanes could be added;
- There is discussion to improve the area around The Hitchin' Post Restaurant:
 - o Street lights will be added to the intersection;
 - Public Works would like to channelize the access of the parking lot off of River Road:
 - There is no set entrance or exit in the restaurant parking lot.
- This intersection is fully compliant with all traffic standards;
- Public Works has created a crash database in GIS where highest crash rates are viewable on a map throughout the county; and
- If beacon lights and signage is not enough, Public Works may consider rumble strips.

COMMISSIONERS' COMMITTEE ASSIGNMENTS AND UPDATE:

Colm Willis:

- Met with Salem Hospital staff:
 - They have been working on a population health analysis for the region for the past six months;
 - They identified different health risk factors for community members;
 and
 - Commissioner Willis suggested having them come to a Health and Human Services Policy Meeting to present their findings.

OTHER:

• Commissioners Brentano and Willis signed a letter of support having the governor reconsider letting private schools open.
