OLCC APPLICATION - Recommend Approval

HEALTH

Approve Amendment #14 with the Oregon Health Authority to add \$15,057 for HIV Prevention Services, Environmental Health Drinking Water Program and Private Domestic Wells and Public Health.

Approve Amendment #2 to reinstate the agreement with Mid-Valley Behavioral Care Network to add \$204,876 for regional acute psychiatric inpatient services.

PUBLIC WORKS

Approve the Public Improvement Agreement with KSH Construction Company for \$973,973 for the construction of sidewalks and bike lanes on Delaney Road in the City of Turner.

Approve an order canceling uncollectable personal property tax accounts in the amount of \$62,629.79.

COMMUNITY SERVICES

- 1. Consider an order approving the 2016-17 Community Project Grant Applications and Funding Recommendations in the amount of \$54,670 for the following:
 - Friends of Historic Butteville, \$14,955
 - City of Detroit, \$5,715
 - City of Donald, \$14,000
 - City of Turner, \$10,000
 - City of Woodburn, \$10,000
 - Sarah Cavazos

Summary of presentation:

- Community project grants are part of the Oregon Lottery Economic Development Grant Programs;
- Grants are available to cities and non-profit organizations within Marion County that focus on funding projects that increase the livability and safety of communities;
- Five of the seven applications that came forward are recommended for approval:
- The Friends of Historical Butteville are requesting a topographical map and engineering design for a park:
 - o Will increase tourism, recreational activities and safety.
- The City of Detroit has applied for a grant to address tiny houses within their jurisdiction;
- The City of Donald will use the money to help fund an Urban Growth Boundary Expansion Study:
 - The city is struggling with having a capacity for residential housing that can support the level of industry that is in the area.
- The City of Turner will be using the grant money to help with their Mill Creek phased flood mitigation analysis and implementation project:
 - o Involves multiple jurisdictions.
- The City of Woodburn is working on their downtown alley beautification project:
 - o Will address downtown improvement; and
 - Safety by having more well-lit alleyways and creating walking paths to help support businesses.

Board discussion:

- There will be a second round of grant proposals that will be closing on May 26, 2017:
 - o There is \$65,000 available for the second round.
- Commissioner Cameron declared a potential conflict of interest regarding the City of Detroit grant distribution due to owning property in Detroit.

MOTION: Commissioner Cameron moved for approval of order approving the 2016-17 Community Project Grant Applications and Funding Recommendations in the amount of \$54,670 for Historic Butteville, City of Detroit, City of Donald and City of Turner. Seconded by Commissioner Brentano; motion carried. A voice vote was unanimous.

2. Consider adoption of an administrative ordinance granting Zone Change/Comprehensive Plan Amendment (ZC/CP) 16-001/Gray. – Joe Fennimore

Summary of presentation:

- Requesting to change the comprehensive plan design from Special Agriculture to Rural Residential and to change the zone from Special Agriculture to Acreage Residential 10, acreage residential with a 10 acre minimum lot size;
- Five acre parcel is located on Ridgeway Drive SE, Turner;
- The Marion County Hearings Officer held a public hearing on April 16, 2016 and on October 24, 2016 recommended the board deny the request unless additional information and evidence was provided;
- The board held a public hearing on February 15, 2017 and the applicant submitted additional information and evidence into the record;
- The board approved the request;
- The ordinance and findings have been prepared and notice of adoption was given on March 8, 2017; and
- The administrative ordinance is set for adoption.

MOTION: Commissioner Cameron moved for adoption of an administrative ordinance granting Zone Change/Comprehensive Plan Amendment (ZC/CP) 16-001/Gray. Seconded by Commissioner Brentano; motion carried. A voice vote was unanimous.

3. Consider approval of the Lease Agreement with the US Department of Energy, Bonneville Power Administration for \$42,700 for transmission line easement and non-exclusive roadway easement. – Alan Haley

Summary of presentation:

- This is an easement for the US Department of Energy, Bonneville Power Administration;
- They are preparing to replace their number one high voltage line between Salem and Albany;
- The line crosses the Browns Island Landfill;
- They currently have an easement as it sits, but the new line coming in will need an additional acre of line easement to cover the sway of the powerlines;
- Will need additional road easements to access the line and install it; and
- The line easement is set for \$10,000 and the road easement is for \$32,700.

Board discussion:

• Non-exclusive roadway easement means Marion County is still allowed to use the road as well as Bonneville Power Administration.

MOTION: Commissioner Cameron moved for approval of the Lease Agreement with the US Department of Energy, Bonneville Power Administration for \$42,700 for transmission line easement and non-exclusive roadway easement. Seconded by Commissioner Brentano; motion carried. A voice vote was unanimous.
