Economic Development – GROW EDC 4th Quarter Report. – Allison McKenzie *Summary of presentation:*

- Primary focus in the 4th quarter is the tourism initiative kicked off with Travel Oregon workshops held in March and April:
 - o 89 people attended;
 - o High participation;
 - o Tourism is one of the top three industries in Oregon besides agriculture and wood products;
 - o 1.8 million cars a year travel Highway 22;
 - o Would like North Santiam River region to be a destination area;
 - o Collecting tourism data;
 - o Travel Oregon suggested:
 - o Create a regional marketing strategy;
 - Travel Salem can market for local businesses in a broader way than if the business did it themselves;
 - o Build a local tourism network; and
 - o Create an annual river festival that celebrates the North Santiam region.
- Working on helping people find funding; and
- Fiscal sponsor for the grant that supported the Aumsville reading program, which is being recognized at the United Way luncheon.

Board discussion:

• Detroit Marina owners are working on permits to dredge the lake and it would be helpful if Ms. McKenzie can help find the funds to do so through her contacts:

- o Will need to find a place for the dirt that is pulled out of the lake.
- Most of the people who are in tourism are creating businesses for themselves;
- Partnering with GROW EDC is free and confidential for business owners; and
- High speed broadband would help businesses and millennials who would like to live in the canyon and work from home.

Summary of Presentation:

- Minority, Women and Emerging Small Business (MWESB) has been revised to Certification Office of Business Inclusion and Diversity (COBID):
 - o Effective January 1, 2016; and
 - o Will also include services for disabled veterans.
- Delegation of Authority:
 - o Allows Chief Administrative Officer to correct minor informalities.
- County shall notify prospective offers of addenda in a manner intended to foster competition and will be posted on ORPIN;
- New exemptions under 50-0010:
 - Acquisition or disposal of real property or interest in real property allows county to enter into leases without a competitive process;
 - o Contracts for professional witnesses or consultants to provide services;
- New addition to the rules under section 50-0020:
 - Architectural & Engineering (A&E) service consultants for Public Works Engineering Division, which allows Public Works to enter into contracts with

A&E providers who have been certified by the State of Oregon up to \$100,000 and those who are not certified up to \$50,000;

o Clarification on contract language and the role of the Finance Department; and

• Risk Management will review indemnification language and additional insurance requirements.
