

PUBLIC HEALTH INTERN (GRADUATE)

The student describes his/her area of interest and goals for professional development. An experience will be planned that may include, but is not limited to, the following examples: perform research, data collection, and data analysis; conduct focused population assessments, e.g. through focus groups or key informant interviews; participate in community health improvement planning, implementation, and outreach; community presentations and outreach to partners; projects related to quality improvement, public health systems, and program evaluation. The experience will include a project so that the student gains experience in project coordination.

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PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE INTERN

Works under PHN or program supervisor; duties depend on assigned program. May manage caseload of clients in applicable program. Observational experiences in other Public Health programs may be arranged. Specific program duties may include, but are not limited to:

Epidemiology (EPID): Gain experience in health promotion and disease prevention & investigation. Conduct data analysis and client education.

Public Health Nursing Administration: Perform research and data collection; may conduct focused population assessments, e.g. through focus groups or key informant interviews; participate in community health improvement planning, implementation, and outreach.

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NURSE PRACTITIONER INTERN

Works under Nurse Practitioner in reproductive health areas (Family Planning, Prenatal, and Sexually Transmitted Infections). Duties may include: obtaining and recording information into a database through use of questionnaires, interviews, and a physical exam; assessing the physical, emotional, and developmental status of individuals and their families; providing positive intervention to maintain, restore, or improve health of the client or their family; revising a treatment plan on the basis of client responses and/or new information regarding appropriate management of specific problems; developing and implementing a treatment plan for each client. Student will work in the Family Planning & Prenatal Clinic and the STI clinic.

REQUIREMENTS	Current RN license; must be enrolled in an approved Nurse Practitioner program <ul style="list-style-type: none">• 100 hour minimum (please inquire for further detail)
