		The Mental Health Awareness Month proclamation was approved by the Board of Commissioners at the Board Session at the Chemeketa Community College evening event, which was videotaped and posted on the Marion County webpage.
		There will be a spot on KMZ local radio speaking about Mental Health Awareness in June.
12:10-12:30	Marion County Drinking Water Systems (Katrina)	What is Marion County's (MC) role and responsibilities when there is a drinking water advisory?
		Drinking water regulations in the U.S. are set by the EPA, they set the standards, OHA administers and enforces safe water drinking standards at the State level, and they partner with County Health Departments and the Department of Agriculture to make sure standards are being met.  Any systems that are surface water or serve 3300 or
		more are regulated by OHA, which includes City of Salem.  OHA has a contract with MC to monitor ground water

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		that serves a population less than 3300.
		There are 228 public water systems in MC that serve 350,000 people, 17 systems are regulated by OHA, 19 systems are regulated by Department of Agriculture and 192 systems are regulated by MC Environmental Health.
		There are now new rules from OHA to test the water for cyanobacteria every 2 weeks and new criteria to lift a drinking water advisory.
		City of Salem has a website that gives updates on the water quality.
