General Food Safety

Scented, No-Splash/Splash-less, and Laundry chlorines (bleach) are not safe for restaurant use. A 5-point violation may be cited if these are stored in the kitchen (*OAR 7-204.11*).

Seasonal Pools

Now's the best time to prepare your pool for the winter. The steps you take now can make reopening your pool much easier in the spring:

- Clean & vacuum the pool before closing it Debris left in the water or on the walls will only get worse over the winter
- Test the water and balance chemicals A healthy pH and chlorine level can help reduce algae growth in the water, especially if temperatures are above 60°F.
- Use a secure pool cover
 Covers help maintain pool chemistry and help keep out debris and pests.
