The program consists of 4 unique lessons for each grade group, that are approximately 35 minutes each. Each session includes a lesson plan with learner outcomes, a detailed outline of directions, and all materials including corresponding PowerPoint presentations.
	Nicotine Waste Disposal Guide	Learn how to safely dispose of vaping devices confiscated at your school. The Oregon Health Authority (OHA) and the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) have developed a Nicotine Waste Disposal Guide for Oregon Schools. Nicotine is an acute, P-listed hazardous waste and the lithium-ion batteries found in vaping devices are universal hazardous waste that pose a fire and safety hazard.
	Interventions	<b>3</b> <sup>rd</sup> <b>Millennium Classrooms</b> is an evidence-based online education resource that offers Nicotine 101, a course that can be used with students who are caught smoking or vaping on school grounds. The course is designed to provide the necessary information and tools students need to make informed, health decisions.
	Quitting	This is Quitting is a free mobile program designed to help young people quit vaping. The first-of-its-kind text messaging program incorporates messages from other young people like them who have attempted to, or successfully quit e-cigarettes.
