PURPOSE AND SIGNIFICANCE:

The Marion County Integrated Delivery System (IDS) is based on a fee-for-service reimbursement system that is designed to support the medically necessary mental health needs of Members receiving services and support the accurate and timely reporting of Oregon Health Plan (OHP) encounter data within the IDS Providers. The financial system is structured to allow IDS Providers to have successful business operations within the integrated system.

This financial system is not intended to negatively impact any OHP recipient or create barriers to Member rights including the right to access care, continuity of care, or continued care within the IDS Provider of their choosing.

PROCESS AND/OR PROCEDURE:

Each IDS Provider is responsible for collecting and processing electronic claims/encounter data in a timely manner. Submission of claims/encounter data will be made to the Third Party Administrator (TPA). Reimbursement will be provided on a claim-by-claim basis and will be according to the applicable and current fee schedule for the IDS Provider and service provided. IDS Providers will receive reimbursement within ten (10) days of submission.

The TPA is responsible for the submission of encounter data to the State of Oregon that is consistent with the guidelines and meets the deadlines established by the State. The TPA will work directly with agencies to make corrections to data as required. IDS Providers are expected to submit all encounter data resulting from services to Members and make corrections as requested by the TPA.

Encounter data submitted by the IDS Providers will then become the basis for future calculations of OHP capitation rates and distribution.
