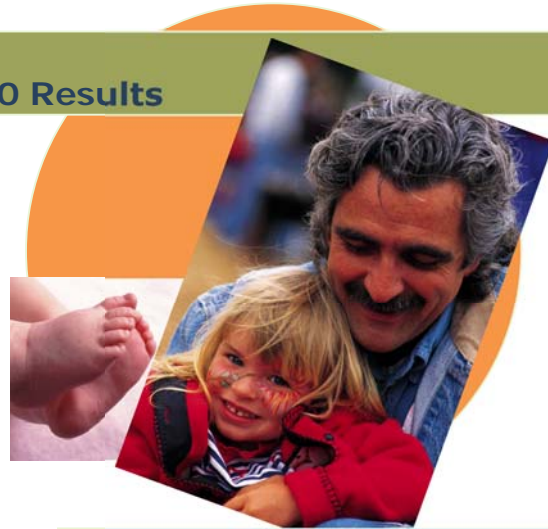


Marion County Children & Families Commission 2010 Results

It's All in the Numbers

The numbers paint the picture. Child abuse prevention works. Community problem solving works.

- ◆ Child abuse and neglect: down 29% in 3 years
- ◆ Foster care children: down 24% in 4 years
- ◆ Babies born drug positive and taken into protective custody: down 90% in 4 years
- ◆ 8th graders meeting reading standards: increased 10% in 3 years
- ◆ High school completion: increased 9% in 2 years
