CLOSING DATE: WEDNESDAY, MARCH 9, 2011**

The following questions have been asked by one or more vendors and are answered herein. We attempted to answer most questions. There were both repeat and irrelevant questions.

1. Is there the possibility for multiple awardees per subset?

Answer: No, one (1) award per subset (i.e. medical, dental, pharmaceutical, etc.) However, there is a possibility of one vendor being awarded multiple services.

2. Is there a need for mental health therapists from a vendor or are they fully staffed with County employees?

Answer: Contract employees for prescriptions. Therapists are County employees.

3. What are the qualifications needed for RN's to work at the facility?

Answer: R.N. license, Minimum 3 (three) year's experience.

4. How many prescriptions per month on average are ordered for the inmates in your facility?

Answer: 800-1160

5. What percentage of your medications ordered each month are stock vs. patient specific prescriptions?

Answer: Approx. 10% are stock, remaining is patient specific.

6. Does the facility have high speed internet connectivity-Broadband, DSL, or Dial-up?

Answer: High-Speed Broadband

7. What are the pricing terms of your current pharmacy agreement?

Answer: See Attachment A

8. How much does your facility currently spend annually for pharmacy services?

Answer: \$250,000 +

9. Please provide the most recent three months of drug utilization preferably in an electronic format?

Answer: Drug utilization varies from month to month.

10. How many inmates receive Hep. C treatment? What is the nature of the treatment?

Answer: Very Minimal. Facility does not blanket treat Hep-C unless there are signs and symptoms.

11. How are medications delivered and dispensed: patient-specific or stock/pill line?

Answer: Medications are dispensed and delivered by RN's in the living units of the jail and both are patient specific and stock.

12. Where are medications administered? Are the medications administered by nurses or correctional staff? How often?

Answer: Medication is administered 3 times a day by nursing staff.

13. Is there a self-administration or "keep-on-person" medication system?

Answer: Some medications are on a "keep-on-person", asa, tylenol, tums, zantac, motrin 400's.

14. What is the number of prescriptions per inmate?

Answer: Five (5) on average.

15. What is the number of HIV patients and the number of inmates on HIV therapy by drug type?

Answer: Currently one individual on HIV medications. We never change these medications but only go by what the outside doctor prescribes.

16. Is the facility currently licensed (permitted) by the Oregon Board of Pharmacy?

Answer: Yes

17. Is the facility currently registered by the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) to receive stock controlled substances?

Answer: Yes

18. What are the terms of your current returns process?

Answer: Full credit for full packets and partial credit for partial packets returned.

19. What is the Oregon Rule or Statue that allows the Sheriff's Office to receive credit on dispensed prescriptions?

Answer: Credit received for dispensed prescriptions is part of current contract. It is effective an the best process for removal of unused medications.

20. How many medications carts are needed?

Answer: 2

21. How often are pharmacists' inspections?

Answer: Quarterly

22. Is Marion County looking to have electronic medical records that require laptops on medication carts, if so will Marion County be providing the laptops or will the pharmacy be responsible?

Answer: Yes, MCSO is looking for an electronic medical records system that would require laptops on the medication carts.

23. Would Marion County be interested in a computer system that will allow the nursing department to print Medication Administration Records on-site, and communicate with the pharmacy, run usage reports, etc: and will pharmacy be responsible for providing computers or does the health services team have computers with internet?

Answer: Yes

24. Will you provide the current pharmacy bid rate? If not, is there a public website where this information can be obtained?

Answer: See Attachment A

25. Please provide a copy of the current pharmacy's contract?

Answer: Most information should be found in Attachment A

26. What is the percentage of inmates that are federal, US Marshalls or ICE? Does the current vendor bill these entities directly for you? If not, would you wish for these to be billed directly?

Answer: Billed to County.

27. Are any medications sent in bulk bottles?

Answer: There are no bulk bottles of medications.

28. What formulary is currently followed.....vendor or facility's formulary? Please provide a copy of the current formulary.

Answer: Formulary list was produced with combination of vendor and facility.

29. What is the current process for Non-Formulary medication use?

Answer: Prescribers need to justify. If ordered off formulary for Psychiatric QMHP will ask family to provide or go to community for supplies.

30. How are scheduled controls currently being destroyed?

Answer: They are sent back to the vendor.

31. Does your facility currently have a KOP Medication program?

Answer: Yes

32. What formulary is currently followed.....vendor or facility's formulary? Please provide a copy of the current formulary.

Answer: Current formulary was developed by jail, prescriber and pharmacy vendor.

33. Do the med carts need to be brand new or can they be refurbished carts? Are the current carts able to be purchased or are new cart required?

Answer: The facility needs new carts.

34. Will you require bidders to prove they have experience in providing the FDA mandated Pedigree Papers for stock medications via an electronic online software program?

Answer: No

35. An Oregon wholesaler license is required to provide stock to jails in Oregon, must bidder enclosed their Oregon wholesaler license to be considered.

Answer: Current contract handles Oregon wholesale license.

36. Will stock medications dispensed required to be packaged in blister packs? If so bidders are required by the FDA to be or utilize a certified re-packer, will you require all bidders to submit evidence of this?

Answer: Yes, blister packs will be required. Yes, facility will require bidders to submit evidence.

37. Are you currently using an online ordering program? If so, which program is currently used? If not would you consider using one?

Answer: Yes, we are using an on-line ordering system and barcode scanner via Correct RX.

38. Would you be willing to use electronic MARs?

Answer: Yes

39. Is there a current barcode management system in place? Does the system account for every dose administered or is the system used for inventory reconciliation and order placement only?

Answer: No barcode management system in place. Current system is used for inventory, reconciliation and order placement.

40. Does the current pharmacy provider have an interface with your jail management system?

Answer: No

41. Are bidders permitted to submit alternate bid options in addition to requested bid format?

Answer: Yes

42. Is the jail accredited by the NCCHC or ACA?

Answer: No

43. For your quarterly inspections will you require a Oregon licensed pharmacist (which is required by the Oregon Board of Pharmacy) who is an employee of the providing pharmacy's staff? Should their license be submitted with proposal?

Answer: Yes

44. Can you please provide a list of all state and federal licenses currently in this facility's name? (e.g. DEA, state pharmacy license, etc.)?

Answer: N/A

45. Do you currently have a correctional facility drug outlet license? Is there currently an Oregon licensed pharmacist as pharmacist in charge?

Answer: Yes, pharmacist in charge.

46. Are services to begin within 10 days of award notice?

Answer: TBD

47. Will there be an opportunity to ask more questions in the event the responses are not clear?

Answer: No

48. Regarding the "Note" on page 7 about nursing staff, if additional nurses are needed and the County needs help, would the vendor's nurses be only used intermittently and/or temporarily as in "agency" nursing or would there be on-going nursing shifts to cover each week once the need for additional nurses is established? For example, would the vendor be called to fill a shift from time to time or would they be expected to provide a contracted number of nursing hours on a consistent basis?

Answer: Currently, facility has its own full-time nursing staff of County employees. If vendor wanted to propose, proposer would be responsible for full time staffing.

49. Is it possible to get copies of the existing vendor contracts for the services outlined in the RFP? If so, how does a vendor go about requesting applicable contracts?

Answer: See Attachment A – any additional information shall be handled via Public Records Requests.

50. Regarding the sample contract language on page 32, Section 11, is the County willing to add reciprocal indemnification and hold harmless language in which we each agree to hold the other harmless for each party's tortuous acts, if any?

Answer: One (1) M.D., one (1) Dentist, and one (1) Psychiatric N.P.

54. How many Psychiatrists are currently providing psychiatric services?

Answer: None

Answer: Medical Doctor & Psychiatric N.P.

56. What is the current clinic schedule for physicians, dentists, psychiatrists, and OB/GYN physician services?

Answer: M.D. twice a week for 4-5 hours, Dentist once a week, Psychiatric N.P once a week. OB/GYN is done off-campus.

57. What type of IT infrastructure does the County currently have to support an electronic medical records system?

Answer: Run on County network.

Answer: Yes

Answer: There are four (4) mental health counselors employed by County Health Dept.

Answer: Approximately 20 on a daily basis. Approximately 140 on a monthly average.

61. Please provide the FTE currently employed of RN/LPN/MRC/EMT/CAN/CMA.

Answer: Ten (10) FTE R.N.'s

Answer: Yes

Answer: Local provider for OB?GYN is Dr. Rowley.

69. Is the Medical staff currently doing 14 day assessments? PPDs?

Answer: Currently moving towards this as it appears to be Oregon law in near future.

Answer: Ten (10) daily sick calls. Three hundred (300) monthly sick calls.

Answer: No equipment currently in place. Currently using mobile service.

Answer: Age varies in facility.

Answer: Some Measure 11 juveniles.

76. Please share last two years of: current quality indicators/statistics; chronic care data; statistics regarding medical problems such as infection control statistics, # of inmates with medical conditions requiring acute hospitalization, types of medical conditions.

Answer: N/A

77. What is the ratio of HIV and HEP C inmates to total population?

Answer: ration is less then 1%.

78. What is your current electronic Jail Management System?

Answer: Lock & Track

79. What is the average length of stay for inmates housed at MCJ?

Answer: Average stay is nineteen (19) days.

80. What is the average length of stay for inmates transferring to other facilities? Such as US Marshall inmates and HUB transfer inmates.

Answer: Average stay for inmates in transfer is one (1) day.

81. Does MCJ currently have an active quality improvement program?

Answer: Yes

82. Has the MCJ been able to maintain the Medical and Dental staffing levels noted in the RFP? If not, where are specific gaps/problem areas/trends? Are there specific holes, areas of turnover?

Answer: Yes. No specific holes or areas of turnover.

83. Are arrangements in place with any nursing and nursing aide staffing agencies? If so, how would MCJ characterize their satisfaction with these arrangements?

Answer: No. Staffing levels have maintained full staffing for over a year. County has no arrangements with agencies.

84. Please share a sample of each of your current nursing and medical and dental schedules.

Answer: Nursing – Ten (10) nurses total. (6 working 8 hr. shifts and 4 working 10 hr. shifts) M.D. is twice a week. Dentist is once a week. Psych N.P. once a week.

85. MCJ does not currently have onsite skilled nursing services available. What is the current process and standard for caring for these patients? If you utilize acute care hospital services, what is your current utilization management process?

Answer: Current process is to send to hospital. Facility does not utilize acute care.

86. If a vendor can demonstrate competency in skilled nursing, including IV administration, would MCJ allow detainees requiring this level of care to remain onsite?

Answer: each patient would be considered individually.

87. Access to Care: What is your current sick call procedure? How are appointments with staff providers scheduled? What is the number of inmates seen/day for chronic care clinics and sick call clinic?

Answer: Procedure is that inmate writes concerns by kyte system and the nurses triage the kytes and see accordingly.

88. What community – based programs and services does MCJ currently utilize such as: mental health, sex offender counseling, drug/alcohol abuse counseling, or Health Department services?

Answer: Mental health specialists are County employees and provide referrals.

89. How does MCJ provide dialysis to detainees? Could you describe how the county works with other systems to transfer these detainees into other systems?

Answer: Outside company is hired to provide service on-campus for dialysis.

Answer: Yes, there is a current OB/GYN provider. Every pregnant woman is seen.
