**ELDER ABUSE PROTOCOL**

John Turner from the Marion County District Attorney's Office (MCDA) said that HB 2442 mandates that law enforcement, District Attorneys, and the Oregon Department of Human Services, among other entities, must work together in county multidisciplinary teams and develop written protocols for the investigation of, and notification procedures for, cases of abuse of vulnerable adults. An annual report is due to the Oregon Department of Justice. This report will provide statistics on the number of cases of reported abuse, and the results of the reports. Both the MCDA's Office as well as the State DHS will be working with the heads of county law enforcement agencies to complete the protocol and written agreements to comply with the new law. They will also be working together to improve communication, record keeping, and training necessary to comply with the new law, and to better serve the targeted population.

**APPROVAL OF THE 2009 JUVENILE ACCOUNTABILITY BLOCK GRANT**

Juvenile Department Director Faye Fagel reviewed the 2009 Juvenile Accountability Block Grant Program funding plan with the MCPSCC. She said that the Juvenile Department receives funding annually through a Juvenile Accountability Block Grant. These are federal funds that are distributed to county Juvenile Departments by the State Commission on Children and Families. Funding for the 2010 year to Marion County totals \$ 32,755. A portion of these funds will support the Juvenile Department's Guaranteed Attendance Program shelter care program. The rest will be contracted out to the cities of Jefferson, Keizer, Santiam, and Silverton to continue their peer courts.

Tom Sermak made a motion that the MCPSCC approves and strongly supports the 2009 JAIBG funds for spending as described in the plan.

Ed McKenny seconded the motion.  
Motion passes unanimously.

**SCOTTS MILLS TOWN HALL MEETING FOLLOW UP**

Sheriff Myers said that the Scotts Mills follow up town hall meeting was well attended with up to 30 members from the community. Commissioner Milne thanked Sheriff Myers for the well coordinated presentation by his department.
