

Marion County Juvenile Detention

Contraband List

CONTRABAND: Any item prohibited from juvenile possession within detention because its use endangers the safety and security of the facility, staff, and juveniles. Contraband also includes items a juvenile is prohibited from obtaining because it violates the law, a court order, or detention rules.

SUPPLYING CONTRABAND IS A FELONY: A person commits the crime of supplying contraband if the person knowingly introduces any contraband into detention. Marion County Juvenile Department will initiate criminal charges against any person committing such crime.

EXAMPLES OF CONTRABAND INCLUDE:

Aerosol Spray Cans
Aftershave Lotion/Toiletries containing Alcohol
Alcoholic Beverages
Ammunition
Cameras/Camcorders
Cigarette Lighters/Matches
Cigars or Smoking Pipes
Cleaning Products/Caustic Chemicals
Clothing Articles with obscene wording/gang colors/gang insignias
Drugs/Drug Paraphernalia
Electronic Communication Devices
Fireworks
Handcuffs or Keys
Laser Pointer
Mace/Pepper Spray

Metal, Wood, or Glass objects that may be used as weapon, including:

Bats
Needles
Brass Knuckles
Razors/Razor Blades
Chains
Glass Bottles
Knives
Tools
Nails/Screws
Scissors

Paint Thinner, Gas, or Glue
Pornography
Radios
Recording Devices
Sewing Kits
Tobacco
Tattooing Devices
Toy Guns
