and why it's important to participate in this job-creating behavior.




Applewood Retirement Living

gent containers, and paper too! With the addition of mixed recycling, the kitchen has reduced their garbage by 1/3 and their residents are regularly filling their indoor roll-carts.

Recycle Up!

The 100% Recycled Paperboard Alliance says a record number of licensees have signed up during the first six months of 2009.

A total of 18 companies signed license agreements with the alliance allowing them to display the RPA-100% symbol on their packaging. More than 150 companies currently use the symbol, which is reserved exclusively for products and packaging made from 100% recycled paperboard.

Companies signing up during the first half of 2009 include Harland Check, Nestle Purina Petcare and Snyder's of Hanover.

Marion County Waste Reduction Grants













Do you have an idea that could reduce waste in Marion County but lack the funding to implement it? Good news: The Marion County Waste Reduction Grant Program is back!

The Program uses funds set aside from out-of-county medical waste fees. These funds provide grants to effectively reduce waste in Marion County. The objectives of the program are to:

- Reduce the amount of waste generated in Marion County.
- Reduce the amount of waste disposed of at Marion County disposal facilities through appropriate diversions.
- Encourage the development of products made from recovered materials from Marion County, markets for recovered materials and the use of products containing recycled materials.

Two general categories of proposals will be considered: waste reduction projects that directly reduce waste going to Marion County facilities, and promotion and education programs.

For the Fall 2009 offering, a possible \$100,000 in grants is available through the Program. All grants that satisfy any of the program objectives listed above will be considered. Individuals, companies, governments and non-profit organizations with creative ideas for waste reduction are eligible to apply. Visit our website below for complete details.
