Residents can bring these materials to the Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility located at the Salem-Keizer Recycling & Transfer Station (see next panel for location). The Collection Facility is open Thursdays and the first and third Saturday of the month from 8:00am — 3:30pm.

Electronics Recycling

It is now illegal to put televisions, laptops, computers, and monitors in any garbage container. Ask your manager about alternative on-site recycling options. You can also recycle working and non-working electronics for FREE at the Salem-Keizer Recycling & Transfer Station, at the North Marion Recycling & Transfer Station or at the following businesses:

Mixed Recycling



These materials are ok to put in the mixed recycling container.

PAPER

Cardboard, white and colored paper, junk mail, newspaper, magazines, egg cartons, cereal boxes, paper bags, gift wrap, greeting cards, shredded paper (secured inside a box or paper bag), & phone books.

METAL

Rinse first! Tin cans, aluminum cans and foil, metal bottle caps and jar lids, empty aerosol cans (spray nozzle removed), & pure scrap metal (smaller than 18 inches and less than 10 pounds).

PLASTIC

Rinse first! Bottles, tubs & containers only. Must be numbered 1-7 (see below). Please discard caps and pumps. No plastic bags!



NO!

Please do not put these materials in with the mixed recycling:

Plastic bags, glass, styrofoam, garbage, hazardous materials, syringes or sharps, batteries, food soiled or greasy materials, pizza boxes, plastic caps or lids, foam packing peanuts, frozen food boxes, computers, televisions, or toys.









Recycling is Easy!

Recyclable materials can easily be sorted before they get in your garbage. Here are some tips to help you recycle inside your home:

- Keep this list visible in your kitchen or near where you store your recyclables.
- Have a reusable bin or bag meant for mixed recyclables near every garbage container.
- Empty your recycling frequently—whenever you check the mail, do laundry, or pay rent.
- Save space and flatten all boxes and milk jugs.
- Recycling shouldn't be yucky! To reduce issues with odor or stickiness, rinse all food from materials.
