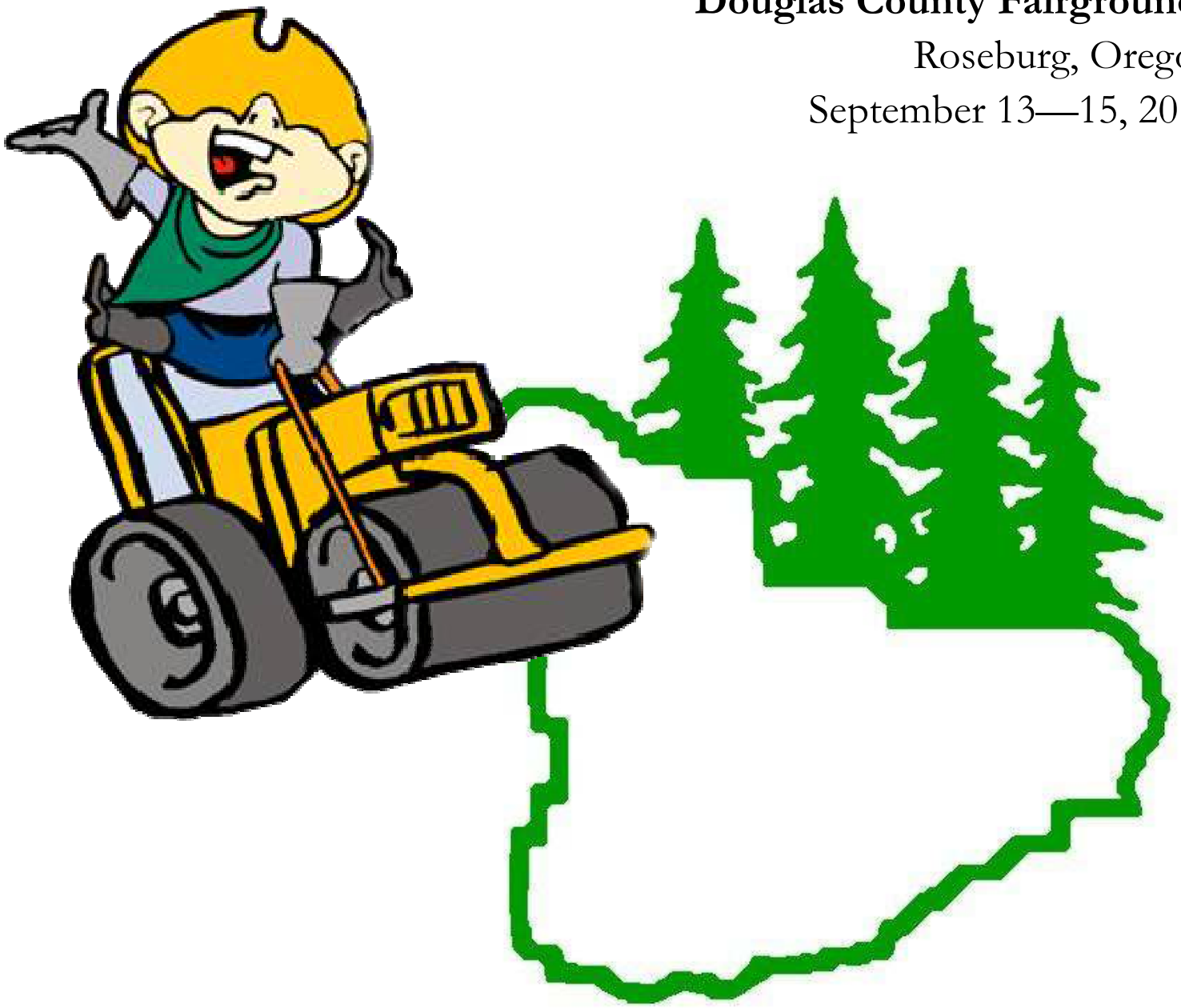

Bill Martin, Oregon Office of Emergency Management

Bill Martin is the lead program analyst with OEM's Operations and Preparedness Section. He is the lead for Critical Infrastructure consequences planning and response coordination, working in cooperation with the Tital Fusion Center, in support of local and tribal governments. He also serves as a Coordination Section Chief within the State Emergency Coordination Center (ECC) during activations. Prior to his work at OEM, he spent 40 years in local and state public safety in California, New Hampshire, and New Mexico.

Tony Jobanek, Oregon T2 Center

Tony Jobanek is a trainer and circuit rider for the Oregon Technology Transfer Center, providing training and educational resources to public agencies throughout Oregon. He worked for the City of Eugene for 34 years as a maintenance worker, PW supervisor, program manager and Fleet Manager. A skilled trainer and communicator, Tony specializes in both technical and soft skills training for public works employees.

Jim Espenel, Retired ODOT

Jim Espenel has a wide range of experience in the maintenance field, having worked for ODOT for 30 years and taught in their Maintenance Academy for 15 years where he developed many of their heavy equipment courses. He now teaches for the Oregon T2 Center.

Sean Metzger, City of Medford

A professionally licensed Land Surveyor, Sean Metzger serves as the City of Medford's Engineering Chief of Field Survey and owns his own surveying firm. He is also an experienced trainer and teaches surveying related courses for Rogue Community College.
