BUSINESS SERVICES

Approve a recommendation to adopt and establish a new classification; Economic Development Coordinator, #167.

COMMUNITY SERVICES

Approve an order reappointing Gayle Caldarazzo-Doty and Jim Seymour to the Children and Families Commission with terms ending January 31, 2020.

Approve Amendment #1 to the Sublease Agreement with Oregon State University to modify the Service District's rental of the Farm Bureau building.

FINANCE

COMMUNITY SERVICES

1. Consider approval of an order distributing Oregon Video Lottery Funds through the 2016-17 Business Development Grants to the following: Detroit Lake Marina, \$35,000, Kane's Marina, \$20,000, and Santiam Ice Company, \$25,000 – Sarah Cavazos

Summary of presentation:

- Community Services oversees the Oregon Lottery Fund for Economic Development purposes;
- A portion of the money is allocated to the Business Development Grant Program;
- The Business Development Grants help fund private sector businesses and target industries to support job retention and job growth;
- For fiscal year 2016-17, there is \$150,000 allocated for the Business Development Grants:
- Working on a rolling application deadline:
 - o Reviewing applications and accepting them as they come in.
- In January 2017, three proposals were before the Economic Development Advisory Board (EDAB) for consideration:
 - o Detroit Lake Marina;
 - o Kane's Marina; and
 - o Santiam Ice Company.
- EDAB recommended all three proposals for funding;
- Regional Solutions has been working in the Santiam Canyon to try and figure out solutions to stimulate the economy and business:
 - O Looking for a solution to use the boat marinas by extending the boating and tourism season when the water levels are low:
 - Both marinas have gone through a permitting process with the Oregon
 Marine Board to go through a dredging and gangplank pilings instillation
 that will allow them to access water levels when they are low; and
 - Potentially extend boating season by five weeks.

- The Santiam Ice Company is one of the very few businesses that are located in Idanha:
 - o Requested \$27,500 to expand their ice production capacity; and
 - o The grant review committee recommended the project be funded at \$25,000.
- There will be four jobs created at the Detroit Lake Marina over the two year period and allows the retention of eight jobs;
- Kane's Marina will create six new jobs and retain 10 jobs over two years; and
- Santiam Ice Company will create six new jobs and retain three jobs.

Board discussion:

- The commissioners are very supportive of economic development in the Santiam Canyon;
- The owner of the Detroit Lake Marina is also the owner of the Santiam Ice Company;
- The commissioners are very proud of the work being done;
- Commissioner Cameron declared a potential conflict of interest due to the fact he moors his boat at one of the marina's during the season;
- There will be other opportunities for other businesses to apply for grants:
 - o There are \$183,250 designated dollars for Business Development Grants;
 - o There is a remaining \$103,250;
 - o In addition, there are Community Project Grants:
 - Supports various projects throughout the county.
 - Last day to submit Business Development Grant applications is April 30, 2017.

 - The Confederated Tribes of the Grand Ronde Community of Oregon applied for a Special Assessment of Open Space Land on 430 acres in Exclusive Farm Use (EFU) zone located on Dieckman Lane SE, Stayton;
 - State law requires the application be processed in the same manner as an amendment to the comprehensive plan;
 - The matter was referred to the Marion Planning Commission, which conducted a public hearing on December 6, 2016 and made a recommendation to the board for approval;
 - The board held a public hearing on January 11, 2017;
 - After considering all the information, the board approved the request; and
 - In order to complete the process the board must approve the order.

- 3. Consider an order approving an application for Special Assessment of Open Space (OS) Case #16-002/ Confederate Tribes of the Grand Ronde Community of Oregon. Joe Fennimore *Summary of presentation:*
 - The Confederated Tribes of the Grand Ronde Community of Oregon applied for a Special Assessment of Open Space Land on 410 acres in Exclusive Farm Use (EFU) zone located at 17294 North Santiam Highway SE, Stayton;
 - State law requires the application be processed in the same manner as an amendment to the comprehensive plan;
 - The matter was referred to the Marion Planning Commission, which conducted a public hearing on December 6, 2016 and made a recommendation to the board for approval;
 - The board held a public hearing on January 11, 2017;
 - After considering all the information, the board approved the request; and
 - In order to complete the process the board must approve the order.

PUBLIC WORKS

A. Continuation of public hearing on appeal of hearings officer's decision denying Partition Case 16-014/ Kaufman, Clerk's file #5719. – Brandon Reich, Cindy Schmitt

Summary of presentation:

- This is a continuation from a public hearing held on January 18, 2017 to partition a nine acre parcel in an Acreage Residential Zone;
- At the hearing last week, a number of issues were identified;
- Two issues have appeared to have been resolved based on the applicant's testimony:
 - The private easement that crosses the subject property from the Canyon Street right-of-way to the north to serve the new proposed parcels; and
 - The ability to evaluate and mitigate for stormwater impacts through the existing stormwater permitting process.
- It appears to Planning Division that now essentially two issues remain unresolved:
 - O Staff will review additional evidence in the record that has been added today and present argument that these may be able to be resolved:

- Fire District standards:
 - Marion County Fire District preformed a site visit to Canyon Street and determined that the existing roadway is accessible to their equipment:
 - o Planning Division finds this issue to be resolved.
- County local access road standards exist in the county engineering standards:
 - Applying these standards would ensure adequate access to the property would satisfy the requirements to the Marion County Comprehensive Plan; and
 - The Transportation System Policy that limits the creation of new parcels on local access roads can be satisfied by requiring that the roadway be improved by county engineering standards.
- Added to the record are pictures of Canyon Street;
- Added into the record is a letter from the applicant's representative with some findings/recommendations for conditions of approval;
- Added to the record is a modified proposal to lay gravel on the shoulders of Canyon Street to widen the road to 16 feet, modified proposal to do improvement adjacent to the subjects property and a turnout at Canyon Street and 70th Avenue;
- The normal requirement in the development of this nature is that all the frontage of the parcel does get improved by county standards at this time of development; and
- Normally, the county requires that the applicant improve all of their frontage.

Board discussion:

- Concerned with the road being so narrow for traffic to pass each other;
- Would like the street to be widened where Canyon Street intersects with 70th Avenue;
- The commissioners proposal is to widen the road adjacent to the applicants property and at 70th Avenue and Canyon Street;
- Paving the road at the intersection is preferable due to rocks eventually being kicked out the 70th Avenue; and
- Ms. Roy reminded the commissioners to listen to the full testimony and public hearing before making decisions on the matter.

Testimony:

Alan Sorem:

- Attorney for the applicant;
- The applicant is supportive of the proposed modifications to the conditions of approval at a concept level;
- Hears staff's report and the logic behind the improvement at Canyon Street and 70th Avenue, there is an understanding of the need for the improvement;
- There is another party that is impacted by the conditions;
- The attorney requests that the record remain open to allow for all of the necessary parties see the proposed design; and
- Would support having the frontage of the property expanded.

Kent Kaufman:

• In regards to the gravel shoulder, the Fire Marshall stated that there are other places sufficient to turn around before the applicants' property.

Commissioner Brentano recessed the meeting for a short break at 10:00 a.m. Commissioner Brentano reconvened the meeting at 10:10 a.m.

Board discussion:

- The applicant is proposing that the board leave the record open for one week to give them time to review the proposal, get comments back and work with staff:
 - o Proposing to bring this back to Board Session on February 8, 2017; and
 - o The applicant will extend the 180 days for 14 days longer.

MOTION: Commissioner Cameron moved to close the public hearing and leave the record open for one week and come back on February 8, 2017 for final consideration. Seconded by Commissioner Brentano; motion carried. A voice vote was unanimous.

Commissioner Brentano read the calendar.

Commissioner Cameron adjourned the meeting at 10:15 a.m.
