- Statesman Journal received information regarding ordinance and did not confirm with county:
- Statesman Journal made own interpretation that cessation products were included in the ban:
- County counsel advised it was never intent of language to include cessation products; and
- Clarifying language will be added that nicotine products do not include the use of any products specifically approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration for sale as a tobacco cessation product if the product is marketed and sold solely for that approved purpose.

### Alan Roberts

- Vocational Rehabilitation Counselor with the state;
- Caseload is clients with developmental and intellectual disabilities;
- Many opportunities in this field, but sees a lot of brain drain from other agencies; and
- Concerned with seeing good people leave their jobs and what that will leave for the core
  of care.

#### Gwyn Marsh

- Is parent of a 42-year-old son with developmental disabilities;
- After her son was born she returned to school to obtain her Master Degree in Elementary Education with a handicap learner endorsement;
- After obtaining her degree she was offered a position at the Children's Guild as an advocate for families with disabilities;
- Later became a Case Manager with Marion County Developmental Disabilities;
- Has now been retired for seven years and was busy working with Red Cross Disaster Relief and caring for aging parents;
- Need for those services has ended and interested in helping in this area; and
- As both a parent and professional, this area is dear to her heart.

#### Reverend Doctor Deborah Patterson

• Relocated here from Missouri five years ago;

- Work has been in non-profit health care administration;
- Previously served as Board Chair of Emmaus Homes in Missouri that provided residential and community-based services for adults with intellectual and development disabilities; and
- Personal interest in committee is due to a 19 year-old daughter that is enrolled in the Community Transition Program of Salem-Keizer School District.

# Doug Short

- Developmentally Disabled Foster Parent for approximately two years;
- Background as a Bank Manager and Financial Planner;
- Wife worked for 15 years at Salem Cardiovascular; and
- Excited about the opportunity to become more involved and knowledgeable in the process of helping kids with developmental disabilities.

- Appreciate work that Rod Calkins and Cary Moller did to recruit such talented people;
- Committee advises the Health Advisory Board;
- Commissioners will be updated on critical information at Management Update as needed; and
