Economic Development – Grow EDC 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter Report. – Allison Ford McKenzie *Summary of Presentation* 

- Quarterly report from July through September 2015;
- Work in small towns east of Salem along Highway 22;
- Worked with 77 individual clients;
- Offers free, confidential one on one consulting;
- 58 people attended workshops over the summer;
- Of the 77 people, 10 have different ideas for new businesses;
- Following up on Economic Vitality Summit held in spring;
- Four projects underway:
  - Objective to launch tourism initiative in the region:
    - Applied for a Rural Tourism Studio "Lite" program:
      - In depth training program to help communities collaborate with each other on tourism ideas.
  - Youth engagement and workforce development:
    - Partnered with Strategic Economic Development Corporation (SEDCOR) and Chamber of Commerce in Stayton to hold a Trades Day; and
    - 500-600 students from four schools participated.

- o Communicate with young professionals group on how to engage with youth in the community, particularly mentoring high school students.
- o Learning Value Chain Methodology:
  - Started training in September; and
  - Purpose is to see how it can be applied to natural resources industry.
- Fiscal sponsor from the United Way Grant for Aumsville's summer literacy program:
  - \$75,000 two-year grant which helps the literacy program and an after school program;
  - o 489 children participated;
  - o Averaged 187 children per session;
  - Vast majority of participants came from Aumsville and Stayton;
  - o Total of 211,000 hours read;
  - O Summer program started six years ago with eight kids;
  - Held on weekly on Monday during the summer; and
  - 20 volunteers participate.

- Grow EDC has not talked with Travel Salem about the Grayline tours; and
- Been talking with Travel Salem about the eclipse happening in August 2017.

Economic Development – SEDCOR 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter Report. – Chad Freemen, Nick Harville

- Connecting companies to resources and the region;
- Been working on a Cascadia threat series:
  - Three part series how to help businesses cope with a major earthquake;
  - How to stay connected in the community;
  - o Looked at survival of the community; and
  - o 90 people showed up at the last meeting.
- Focus on recruitment and retention of jobs in the region;
- One hurdle is the lack of building inventory;
- Strength of available land in the area;
- Companies focused on this region:
  - Food processing;
  - o Manufacturing; and
  - o Distribution.
- Last quarter there has been significantly more interest from Portland based companies;
- Statewide there has been consolidation of businesses as a whole;
- Precision Cast Parts and Diamond Foods have been acquired;
- Trades Day in Stayton was also sponsored by Willamette Education Service District (WESD);
- Next Trades Day is scheduled to be held at Gervais High School;
- Looking at Career Technical Education (CTE) training;
  - o Agricultural Science;
  - o Construction; and
  - o Fabrication.

- New business in Stayton is Yancey Pallet which is owned by Willamette Valley Lumber:
  - Located at the old Mastercraft building.
- North Santiam School District Superintendent, Andy Gardner speaking with local businesses about needs:
  - o Type of employee needs; and
  - o Formed a business advisory group to talk to high school teachers about what skills the kids need to be successful in the workforce.
- Several companies in Marion County are looking at expansions;
- Significant projects throughout the county to lessen dependency on Port of Portland:
  - o Not to replace but to supplement; and
  - o Alternatives being worked on.

#### **Board Discussion:**

- It's great to see the business industry partnering with the school districts to get young people connected within the CTE programs;
- Programs at MacLaren have partnered with Chemeketa Community College to make sure the equipment is a seamless transition for youth to go into a technical program;
- Business Retention and Expansion (BR&E) program data is being collected and housed at the SEDCOR office:
  - Sarah Cavazos and Tamra Goettsch have offered their assistance disseminating all the data.

- If the county waives the minor informality, the proposal will be moved into evaluation phase;
- If the county does not waive the minor informality, this proposer will be declared non-responsive and be removed from evaluation process; and
- Email attachment of the proposal will be sufficient.
