PRESENT: Commissioner Kevin Cameron, Commissioner Sam Brentano and Commissioner Janet Carlson. Also present Gloria Roy as county counsel and Kristy Witherell as recorder.

Commissioner Cameron called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

Economic Development – Travel Salem's 4th Quarter Report. – Angie Morris *Summary of presentation:*

- Working on a river themed music event for the eclipse in 2017;
- Silver Creek Falls vacation idea reached one million exposure;
- An airline magazine featured the Oregon Garden reaching 11 million exposure
 - o Featured on Channel 8
- Seven Brides Brewing featured on Brew Public, which was a 1.7 million exposure;
- Attended Travel & Words Northwest Writer's Conference in Walla Walla, Washington in the 4th quarter:
 - o Pitched to 25 editors and reporters about the area;
 - o Will be hosting that conference in 2017; and
 - o Excellent exposure for Salem and surrounding area.
- Attended the National Association of Sports Commissions in Grand Rapids, Michigan:
 - o Walked away with four Requests for Proposals (RFP) and four strong leads; and
 - o Trying to capture sports oriented tournaments and events.
- Hosted annual Salem Upfront event at Willamette Heritage Center:
 - o Frontline staff of lodging centers can see products themselves; and
 - o Featured twenty two exhibitors.
- Visitor Information table at the United Methodist conference;
- Higher productivity year over year;
- 53,652 requests for information about our region;
- Facebook reach up 200% due to paid advertisement;
- 60 percent increase in events on the ground;

- 80 percent increase in membership:
 - o 30 percent reduction in attrition.
- \$1.48 million in total Travel Salem resources versus \$730,000 two years ago;

Board discussion:

- For larger events, hotels are not able to accommodate;
- Higher demand for rooms, especially downtown;
- Economic impact of each event calculated by various indicators:
 - o Average length of stay;
 - o Number of hotel rooms used;
 - o Average food and transportation expenses; and
 - o Ancillary daily expenses.
- Would like to find ways to help promote national contests.

Approve Amendment #3 with Ursula White to add \$52,000 in funding for Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner services.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY/TREASURER'S OFFICE

1. Consider approval of the contract for services with Can/AM Technologies, Inc. for \$237,740 for a cash accounting system through August 2021. - Tom Frey & Laurie Steele

Summary of Presentation:

- It's been a long term goal to have a point of sale system in Marion County;
- Most departments do not have a cash handling system;
- Main goal is to improve control of cash flow and have consistent reporting; and
- Can/AM was chosen after an extensive search for a provider.

Board discussion:

- Some departments have sufficient cash controls in place and may not have to implement the new cash receipting system;
- Has excellent daily reconciliation capabilities;
- The ferry may not change their current process, but it is being looked at; and
- At the end of the five years the county will have to renegotiate continued software support.

MOTION: Commissioner Brentano moved for approval of the contract for services with Can/AM Technologies, Inc. for \$237,740 for a cash accounting system through August 2021. Seconded by Commissioner Carlson; motion carried. A voice vote was unanimous.

PUBLIC WORKS

2. Consider approval of the Intergovernmental Agreement with Oregon Department of Transportation for \$969,000 to widen portions of 45th Avenue. – Cindy Schmitt

Summary of presentation:

- Serves a large residential area;
- Runs along east side of Chemeketa Community College;
- Services 4,000 cars a day;
- A lot of foot and bicycle traffic as well;
- Would like to construct sidewalks and bike lanes;
- With approval of agreement, engineering would start this fall and construction would start in 2018; and
- Applying for additional funds through SKATS.

MOTION: Commissioner Carlson moved for approval of the Intergovernmental Agreement with Oregon Department of Transportation for \$969,000 to widen portions of 45th Avenue. Seconded by Commissioner Brentano; motion carried. A voice vote was unanimous.

- 3. Consider approval of the Intergovernmental Agreement with Oregon Department of Transportation for \$2,285,000 for the Hayesville Drive project. Cindy Schmitt
- Summary of presentation:
 - East west corridor that connects Highway 99 E, Lancaster Drive and Cordon Road;
 - Completion of two existing curb sections;
 - Plan for construction in 2018;
 - Fairly busy road, 6,500 cars a day;
 - Four schools in the area; and
 - Only a narrow bike lane:

Board discussion:

- Have fairly wide right of way so front yards will not be affected;
- Neighbors are appreciative of sidewalks;
- Will send notices and hold neighborhood meetings to notify residents;
- Utility poles will need to be relocated;
- Underground lighting has been considered, but it is up to the utilities company and the cost is substantially higher; and
- There are few street lights and looking at select areas around crosswalks to install more.

MOTION: Commissioner Brentano moved for approval of the Intergovernmental Agreement with Oregon Department of Transportation for \$2,285,000 for the Hayesville Drive project. Seconded by Commissioner Carlson; motion carried. A voice vote was unanimous.

- 4. Consider approval of the Intergovernmental Agreement with Oregon Department of Transportation for \$469,000 for the Ferry Boat project. Cindy Schmitt
- Summary of presentation:
 - Covers automated signing, parking paving and catwalk;
 - Adds electronic signing that can be controlled remotely;
 - Will try to add signage on the freeway to notify ferry closures; and
 - There will be a third phase, but this work will happen over the next 18 months.

Board discussion:

- Right now there is no signage for the ferry on Interstate 5;
- Hoping for more traffic on the Buena Vista Ferry;
- Buena Vista Ferry has more capacity than the current demand; and
- Make people aware that there are other options to get over the river.

MOTION: Commissioner Brentano moved for approval of the Intergovernmental Agreement with Oregon Department of Transportation for \$469,000 for the Ferry Boat project. Seconded by Commissioner Cameron; motion carried. A voice vote was unanimous.

- 5. Consider approval of the Intergovernmental Agreement with Oregon Department of Transportation for \$1,236,000 for the Delaney Road project. Cindy Schmitt
- Summary of presentation:
 - City of Turner was able to secure federal funding;
 - The county is delivering the project;
 - Contributing \$50,000 to the overlay of the road;
 - The right of way acquisition is complete, but waiting for final sign off by federal agency;
 - Construction postponed for next spring and summer;
 - Completion date is September 30, 2017;
 - Adds sidewalks and bike lanes;
 - Carries truck traffic off of the interstate; and
 - Project will cover 3rd through 7th Street.

Board discussion:

- Have had a long-term project discussion to widen Delaney Road; and
- Very expensive and could cost \$8-10 million.

MOTION: Commissioner Brentano moved for approval of the Intergovernmental Agreement with Oregon Department of Transportation for \$1,236,000 for the Delaney Road project. Seconded by Commissioner Carlson; motion carried. A voice vote was unanimous.

- 6. Consider approval of the contract for services with Chris Dials Contracting, Inc. for \$144,257 to reconstruct the Howell Prairie Road culvert through August 15, 2017. Cindy Schmitt *Summary of presentation:*
 - Large culvert failure in spring 2015;
 - Asking contractor to replace metal pipe;
 - Contractor is prepared to start August 22, 2016; and
 - Howell Prairie Road will be closed for three weeks.

MOTION: Commissioner Carlson moved for approval of the contract for services with Chris Dials Contracting, Inc. for \$144,257 to reconstruct the Howell Prairie Road culvert through August 15, 2017. Seconded by Commissioner Brentano; motion carried. A voice vote was unanimous.
