#### **BUSINESS SERVICES**

 Consider approval of the Public Improvement Agreement with Hydro-Temp Mechanical for \$1,019,135 to remediate the county jail heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) system. – Colleen Coons-Chaffinx, Camber Schlag, Brendan Crossley, Construction Project Coordinator

## Summary of presentation:

- Request for Proposal (RFP) solicitation was identified as best option for the Jail HVAC Remediation Project because of the critical nature of the work:
  - Requires a greater emphasis on the general contractor's experience and technical ability;
  - o Board of Commissioners granted the exception to allow the use of an alternative solicitation process through board order 14-86; and
  - o RFP issued on October 3, 2014 and closed on November 3, 2015.
- Two proposals were received:
  - o Total cost to perform the work on the Jail HVAC exceeded anticipated county budget for project;
  - November 17, 2015, the county issued a clarification request to each proposer requesting breakdown and explanation of costs;
  - Evaluation committee determined that Hydro-Temp Mechanical Inc. was the awarded Jail HVAC Remediation Project on December 12, 2014; and
  - O December 2014 through March 10, 2015, county performed Value Engineering with Hydro-Temp Mechanical to take advantage of potential cost savings without impairing the essential functions or characteristics of public improvement.
- Jail was built more than 27 years ago and another phase was built 20 years ago:
  - Jail has 155,000 sq. ft.;
  - Current HVAC system is inefficient and lacking any adequate capacity;
  - o HVAC system has exceeded 15 year life span and is actually nearing 27 years;
  - O All condensers, air handlers, dampers, heat pumps, fans, variable frequency drives, direct digital controls (DDC) and all related components will be replaced; and
  - o Project completion date is scheduled for late January 2016.

# Board discussion:

- As it is now, all alternatives have been rolled into project:
  - o DDC controls; and
  - o Equipment that was going to be refurbished is now full replacement.
- In order to do project, inmate shuffling will have to take place;
- Good timing since there is one pod that is closed; and
- Will provide opportunities for the facilities staff to take care of some maintenance issues.

**MOTION:** Commissioner Cameron moved approval of the Public Improvement Agreement with Hydro-Temp Mechanical for \$1,019,135 to remediate the county jail HVAC system. Seconded by Commissioner Brentano; motion carried. A voice vote was unanimous.
