PUBLIC WORKS

1. Consider adoption of an ordinance approving amendments to the Marion County Floodplain Overlay Zones, by emergency procedure. – Brandon Reich

Summary of Presentation

- Proposed amendments: The definitions of substantial damage and substantial improvement in the floodplain overlay zones, adopt exemptions to the regulations of the overlay zones, and amend the urban code regarding structures exempt from requirement of elevation certificates;
- No testimony was given at the public hearing on July 23, 2014, and the board voted to concur with the amendments to the floodplain overlay zones; and,
- Staff recommends the ordinance be adopted by emergency procedure so exemptions go into effect immediately and construction of any newly exempt activities can take place before the October flood season begins.

Board discussion:

- The new amendment states that if the flood or fire damage exceeds 50 percent of the value of the home, it would need to be brought up to current floodplain standards:
 - o If necessary, the home would have to be elevated above the base flood elevation; and,
 - Openings would have to be installed in the garage to drain floodwaters.
- The existing rule is set at 20 percent damage. The new amendment would give more options and flexibility to homeowners.

MOTION: Commissioner Cameron moved that the chair read the ordinance by title only twice. Seconded by Commissioner Brentano; motion carried. A voice vote was unanimous.
