 - Reduced to \$6.5 million through cost-cutting measures.
 - Potential service cuts include:
 - Library reduced to 20 hours per week.
 - West Salem library closure.
 - Parks services cut by 30%.
 - Elimination of summer youth recreational programs.
 - Approximately 30 employee layoffs.
 - Pending levy vote to address budget challenges.
 - o Discussions about urban renewal areas and potential tax revenue sources.
 - Exploring expansion of urban growth boundary to attract tax-paying entities.
- Keizer:
 - Keizer Community Fields project progressing:
 - Phase two underway, including:
 - Bathrooms.
 - Sidewalk connections.
 - Food truck pads.
 - · Bicycle racks.
 - Picnic tables.
 - Successful management by Keizer Community Fields nonprofit.
 - Supports multiple sports teams, including lacrosse and soccer.
- Marion County:
 - Ongoing water supply and infrastructure projects.
 - Broadband access initiatives.

- o Exploring partnership opportunities with Salem.
- Continued development of community services.
