Commissioner Colm Willis called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m.

## Warm Springs Power Pathway Overview

- Warm Springs Power and Water Enterprises manages the tribe's energy interests.
- Currently owns 49.99% of Pelton Round Butte hydro project.
- Option to become majority owner by 2036.
- Views itself as an energy tribe with a long-term, seven-generation approach to development.
- Consists of three tribes: Warm Springs, Wasco, and Paiute.
- Seeks to develop renewable energy opportunities on reservation lands.
- Proposed transmission line upgrade from 230 kV to 500 kV.
- Spans approximately 100 miles from Round Butte to Salem.
- Secured \$250 million Department of Energy (DOE) grid resilience grant.
- Utilizes existing right-of-way through tribal, federal, and private lands.
- Aims to increase grid capacity to approximately 2,000 megawatts.
- Potential to support new energy generation, including solar and geothermal.
- Will enable transmission of renewable energy across the Cascades.

## Other

- Potential for attracting data centers and high-tech companies to Marion County.
- Opportunity for economic development in rural areas.
- Possible fiber optic infrastructure expansion.
- Collaborative approach with multiple utilities (Bonneville, Pacific Power, PGE).
- Minimal environmental impact due to using existing transmission corridor.

## **Next Steps**

- Conduct preliminary studies in current year.
- Begin permitting process.

- Establish community advisory group.
- Engage with local stakeholders, including neighborhood associations.
- Develop economic development strategy.
- Target construction start in 2030.
- Continue multi-utility coordination and planning.
