Legislative Update:

-Alvin Klausen

Summary of presentation:

- American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) extension letter of support;
 - Marion County is drafting a resolution to go to the July NACo Conference for consideration;
- Letter of support from Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board (OWEB);
 - Push 2021 budget to 2023
 - Marion County will sign onto the letter from OWEB
- HB 2405 Requires that court dismissing charges involving orders of commitment due to defendant lacking fitness to proceed also order transport of defendant back to jurisdiction in which charges were initiated;
 - Senate hearing April 13th;
 - Representative Diehl would like a representative of the BOC to testify;
 - Undersheriff Wood is testifying;
- SB 907 Prohibits employer from retaliating or discrimination against employee or prospective employee who, in good faith and with no reasonable alternative, refuses exposures arising from hazardous condition at place of employment;
 - Going to vote today;
- SB 1012 Authorizes county to allow homestead rebuilt by same owner on same
 lot to replace homestead destroyed by September 2020 wildfires to have specially
 assessed value equal to destroyed homestead's real market value for 2020-2021
 property tax year, to extent of square footage of destroyed homestead;
 - Going to vote today;
- HB 3260 Authorizes self-service dispensing of Class 1 flammable liquids at retail establishment if the dispensary is in a city in Marion County located in a geographically defined area and city was impacted by 2020 wildfires;
 - Going to vote today;

- SB 488-6 Requires municipal solid waste incinerator that accepts more than specified amounts of hospital, medical or infectious waste in calendar year to meet federal emissions limits for hospital, medical or infectious water incinerator;
 - Amendment was adopted but no floor vote scheduled;
- HB 3571 Establishes immunity from prosecution for theft in first degree and civil liability for nonprofit animal rescue entity that takes possession of, keeps, and disposes of cat of dog as provided in Act and;
 - o Bill died, recommended for session next year.

- Send ARPA letter to Senator Merkley's office and request they write their own letter;

- HB 2405 Commissioner Cameron to attend;
- SB 1012 and HB 3260 e-mail Canyon citizen list asking for testimony and;
- See if the Oregon Humane Society can sign the agreement now?

Idanha-Detroit Rural Fire Protection District (IDRFPD) – Idanha Fire Department Septic Costs

Summary of presentation:

- 55 commercial properties identified;
- IDRFPD in early scoping stages;
- Met with Business Oregon, stated project not out of scope;
- 3 options;
 - Adjust to include IDRFPD;
 - Leave as is and;
 - County to more directly engage with the city to get additional details to see if it should be integrated to transitional septic network.

Board Direction:

- BOC supports writing the criteria to allow the IDRFPD to participate in the septic program;
- BOC would need additional details before considering fund for IDRFPD rebuild;

Sno-Cat Snow Transportation Vehicle

Summary of presentation:

- Will be at Board Session on 4/19 for approval of Sno-Cat purchase;
- Two high elevation radio communication sites, visited year-round;
 - Hall Ridge;
 - House Mountain maintain the entire site year-round providing routine maintenance.
- Current Sno-Cat, 40 years old and out of service;
 - Over \$100,000 in required repairs
- New Sno-Cat \$220,000;
- Recently had on-site equipment failure. Used Linn County's equipment to access site;
 - Not an ideal situation;
- Used Marion County's bid process in February one bidder and;
 - Met requirements and needs.

Public Comments of Floodplain Environmental Impact Statement (EIS)

Summary of presentation:

- Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) published notice of intent for Floodplain EIS;
- FEMA soliciting public comments for concerns, issues, and reasonable alternatives;
- Marion County's local floodplain code and development could be impacted;
- Deadline for comments is May 5th;
- If not adopted;
 - Lose National Insurance Flood Program;
 - Lose federally backed loans;
 - Lose federal disaster aid;
- If adopted;
 - No net loss of floodplain function;
 - o Homes in floodplains can't be replaced per new regulations;
- Group of jurisdictions and professionals banded together in opposition and;
 - Drafting letter.

Board Direction:

- Let the community know what this means exactly for them;
- Get letter being drafted to the BOC;
- The BOC agrees to make public comment after receiving more information;
- Lindsey King to send information and a map of affected areas to the BOC and;
- Lindsey King and Alvin Klausen to work on drafting a letter.
- Coordinate and communicate concerns with AOC and LOC to potentially collaborate

New Climate-Friendly and Equitable Communities (CFEC) Temporary Rules from Department of Land Conservation & Development (DLCD)

Summary of presentation:

- HB 2659 Requires Land Conservation and Development Commission to update rules in response to Governor's executive order on climate to address specific issues;
 - Work session testimony from legislator only
 - Referred bill to rules committee.
- Bill is to reset the climate friendly rules that DLCD adopted;
- · DLCD is adopting temporary rule amendments;
 - o Waiting on outcome of amendments before getting involved;
- Rule amendments do not address Marion County's concerns;
- Drafted letter to DLCD about amendments;
 - Similar HB 2659 letter;
- Proposed Changes;
 - Additional time to request deadline extensions;
 - Modifying some code standards and;
 - Modifying parking standards.

- In drafted letter add safety concerns because of overcrowding;

Next month proceeding with deep soil exploration on the 3 eligible sites. After further testing we will be able to proceed with sites that meet requirements.
