DUII-related Traffic Fatalities -Carl Lund	<p>United Nation’s goal is to reduce traffic fatalities by 50% by 2030. There’s about 36,000 fatalities in the US/year. A little over 500 of those fatalities are in Oregon, 194 are alcohol involves in Oregon Around 40 of those fatalities are in Marion County. 43% of fatalities are alcohol involved=17 a year that involve DUI in Marion County (alcohol only). The national average is 30% for alcohol involved fatalities, so Oregon is on the higher end. How do we reduce these numbers? What does Marion County already do? How can we brainstorm ideas and learn from each other?</p> <p>Josh has seen that DUI groups have the biggest push back. It’s the hardest group to get a hold of their recovery.</p> <p>Victims Impact Panel: anyone who receives a DUI must attend.</p> <p>Diana: Youth only get the message to not drink and drive, not the message to not drive high.</p>

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	<p>Carlos: Bridgeway Recovery Services offer DUII services in English and Spanish. They use interpreting services for other languages. Marion County provides DUI services in English, Spanish, and Russian.</p> <p>Would Carl like to continue coming to meetings?</p>
<p>What are the resources programs offer for the patients with co-occurring diagnosis - Teri, Josh, Laura, Carlos, Eric</p>	<p>Bridgeway has a strong co-occurring program and has recently expanded their QMHP services. Willamette House Council has helped Bridgeway partner up with universities to provide internships after graduation.</p> <p>Marion County's strength is outreach and connection! They continue to provide services in the Canyon every other week with a CADC and a mentor.</p> <p>Teri and Carol are trying to create substance use disorder services for the IDD program.</p> <p>Josh: If someone is struggling with co-occurring disorder, our clinicians will prescribe/help with the medication component and help while they get re-connected with their therapist. But they don't offer behavioral health services. He refers clients to Marion County.</p> <p>Wendy: Kids in juvenile court are required to be in mental health treatment services.</p> <p>Back in the day, "you have to get sober before you address mental health." But they both trigger each other so we must address them both at the same time.</p> <p>Carlos: Expanding services to the deaf community! Our facilities are smoke-free, which can be a large barrier to clients. But if you're looking for a holistic approach, then it addresses BOTH issues to give them a break from all their addictions.</p> <p>Diana: Is there a movement to treat nicotine/vaping + alcohol addiction?</p> <p>Dyan: Child Welfare depends greatly on programs/service providers to help them make decisions on safety which makes an impact on child/parent reunification.</p> <p>Dawn: We struggle with getting people to WANT services. How can we market the services in a way that clients want to engage with them? Self Sufficiency offers 12 different contractors, each provides 7-10 very diverse services (resume building, budgeting, parenting, peer support, etc.)</p>

Jill will keep us updated.</p> <p>Carlos: Passed his written and oral comprehensive exams in his doctoral program! Congratulations!</p> <p>Diana: Free Keizer Center event.
