I. Announcements and Introductions

- Phil Blea is here as a new team leader looking to gain information into the program
- WVCH is ending their contract with Walgreen's
 - Only 24 hour pharmacy in town
 - Only 5% of prescriptions are filled after 9 pm
 - Approximately 30% of members have prescriptions through Walgreens
 - Walgreens is more expensive. To cut cost they are terminating the contract.
 - Pricing in about 30% hike
- Enhanced detox update
 - Funding barriers for OHP and WVCH contracts
 - Entered into a very basic detox contract with BRS
 - Services will be paid back to August 1st
 - Bridgeway has a goal of 9 detox beds

II. Moving the System Forward – Everyone

- 450 users that used the ER more than 8 visits
 - About 92% had chemical dependency or mental health issues
 - How do we get the medical provider system engaged in this work?
 - PCP coordination – Pay for some incentive regarding PCP's
 - Still working to get good communication
- **Shared Purpose**

- Manage the system of care and do some strategic planning for the future
- **SBIRT Implementation in medical facilities**
 - Referrals seem really low
 - Funded at about \$4 a month and running at about \$3
 - Methadone is down about 10% also
- **Capacity Building**
 - Everyone has capacity at this time. No wait lists
- **Preparing for Metrics**
 - Marion County is still paying above DMAP
 - WVCH is looking at putting incentive metrics into provider contracts
 - Could pay for incentives for using SBIRT outside of their capitation
 - Doesn't have to be the same for every clinic

III. Data/Discussion – Dean, Dwight, & Everyone

- OHP Data – Dean
- What's helpful
 - Dean can do a roster with how much clients have been spending and the ER visits, PCP visits, A& D visits
 - Scott has information on who left treatment against medical advice. How many of them are high utilizer's?
- Indigent CD Data – Dwight
 - Much lower
 - Based on unique members
- Mid-Year Utilization Management Outcomes
 - Utilization is significantly low
 - Coordinating care with the PCP
 - Coordination code or modifier
 - 98 range codes for coordination of care
