## **I. Announcements and Introductions**

- Cary Moller talked about the SBIRT (Screening Brief Intervention and Referral to Treatment) training. The trainers are from OHSU. It is a brief intervention (2-3 mins). We would like to see all mental health clinicians trained. More about this in the upcoming months. This will be listed as a performance outcome in the new CCO's.

## **II. 2012 Planning for the future**

New MPCHP contracts with counties – Jim/Cheryl

- Working with MPCHP to have an updated agreement between them and the BCN. The current one goes back to 2005. The chemical dependency contracts go back to 1997, with amendments made.
- Hoping to have the new agreement in place for January
- The MPCHP will be an attachment
- Delegated responsibilities (working plans)
  - Credentialing
  - Grievances
  - Notices of Action
- Would like to follow the Mental Health agreements
- CAPS responsibilities would be parallel to Mental Health responsibilities

Coordinated Care Organizations – Dean/All

- MVHP invited the hospitals to come and have feedback and participation – Salem, West Valley, Santiam, Silverton

- CCO's are not fully described yet
  - Parties at the table are at a potential for risk sharing – fee for service
  - Might be behind other regions organizationally – especially on the hospital side
- Had some dialogue with Yamhill. Have had some problems gaining primary care with Yamhill
- Timeline is short and there is a lot of work to be done
- Good collaboration with the clinicians from the hospitals to do better. It is not business as usual.
  - Challenge is creating a financial model that supports the services

#### Oregon Prescription Drug Monitoring Program

- Are people using it?
- Pharmacies have been submitting data since June 1<sup>st</sup> for schedule 2, 3 & 4 medications that are dispensed to patients. Have to apply to be able to access this information.
  - Patients can also access their own information.
- Limited access

### **III. Enhanced Detox – Cary/Tim**

Update on status of contract amendment to existing detox contract with AMH

- Awards will be announced on Jan 2<sup>nd</sup>. This is to add services not supplement what is currently being served.

If awarded, what will enhanced detox look like for the region?

- Funds will be used to expand services up to 31 beds.
- Requires 24/7 nursing and daily Physician Rounds
- Bridgeway currently defers 7-10 clients to Salem Hospital a week
- Transportation from other communities would be helpful

### **IV. Data/Discussion – Dean/Scott**

Review MPCHP CD Report - Dean

- November had light claims
  - Only 2 ½ check runs in the month
- December will have 5 check runs in the month
- Membership increased .3% from Sept-Oct
- 2011 produced higher cost per patient
- Frequent flyer reports for Yamhill & Marion County
- Maybe there is a possibility for some mentor services for the folks that present often.

### **V. Indigent Panel – Everyone**

Pace of SE66 admits and budget utilization strategies

- Marion County data is high in over utilization
- How do we decide who we should serve so we come in within the budget.

- Clear paths is placing people in a motivation group while waiting for an opening – however it is not a paid service
  - Treatment episode or intensity of services might be the reason for over utilization.
  - May turn to peer and prevention
- Getting to AMH contracted number of individuals seen with SE66 funds
- 641 individuals to service
  - Has to be enrolled in this contract period
  - Must be in service at least 30 days
  - Payer code 65 to terminate
  - Other funding streams, how/who can we supplement
