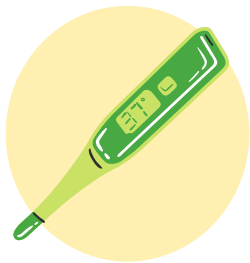


WHEN CAN EMPLOYEES RETURN TO WORK AFTER HAVING COVID-19?

Per Oregon Health Authority's guidelines, employees who have been out sick, even if they were not tested for COVID-19, may return to work when they meet all three of the criteria below:



24 hours have passed with no fever, without the use of medicine, and;



Other symptoms have improved, such as coughing or shortness of breath, and;



At least 10 days have passed since symptoms first appeared. If an employee tested positive for COVID-19, but had no symptoms, they may return to work after 10 days from the date of the positive test result.

Employers do not need to require a note from a healthcare provider to allow employees to return to work. If you are an employer and have questions about this, please call 503-588-5621 for assistance.
