IV. Report on ASA Application Process – Tentative BOC Public Hearing 05-Dec-12

- Rod is submitting his proposal on Nov 21st to the BOC. The board will then make it a draft board order and set a public hearing. At this hearing is where Rod will present his recommendation to appoint ASA's.
- The public hearing is on December 5th at 9:30 am. After the hearing they will approve the recommendation and then Rod will send out contracts for signatures. Contracts with signatures need to be back by the end of December.

- 9 ASA's are being recommended for a 5 year franchise with the possibility of 2-5 year renewals.
