2024 Award Nomination Criteria

Recognizes the outstanding volunteer accomplishments of young people 17 years of age or younger, who volunteer for a county program, division, or department.

Criteria: Service with Care

VALUE: CUSTOMER SERVICE AND PROFESSIONALISM

VALUE: INTEGRITY

Volunteer has demonstrated outstanding concern for and commitment to meet the program's needs and ensure satisfaction when performing their volunteer service.

- 1. Nominee had an outstanding response to the needs and expectations of the volunteer role; and can identify issues and potential problems before they occur.
- 2. Nominee understands program policies, procedures and expectations (as they apply to volunteers) and consistently models while working with peers, staff and the public.
- 3. Nominee takes their volunteer role seriously and demonstrates by fulfilling the commitments they have made. Nominee sought ways to continuously improve while performing their volunteer duties and had excellent communication with staff or team leader.
- 4. Nominee had a direct impact on your ability to serve the public and the outcomes/outputs we were able to achieve (numbers served, shifts filled, training hours completed, etc.).

Criteria: Doing the Right Thing

Volunteer has gone "above and beyond" the call of duty in a particular situation, acting with honesty and integrity at all times.

- 1. Nominee contributed an extra-ordinary amount of time and energy for the good of the overall program, in a specific area, or event. Nominee consistently assists beyond normal expectations of volunteers in the same role.
- 2. Nominee is reliable and holds themselves to account, inspiring trust by saying and doing what is right.
- 3. Nominee is empathetic, and fosters mutual respect among staff, peers and members of the public.
- 4. The nominee faced and overcame extraordinary challenges or circumstances to fulfil their volunteer duties.

Recognizes the outstanding volunteer accomplishments of young people 17 years of age or younger, who volunteer for a county program, division, or department.

VALUE: STEWARDSHIP

Criteria: Driving Change and Innovation

Nominee acts as a champion for change, readily embracing new ideas or adapting to change to better serve the program.

- 1. Nominee assisted with or suggested a new strategy or processes, further acting in the best interests of the work/program.
- 2. Nominee looks for viable solutions to challenges and contributes to implementation of new ideas.
- 3. Nominee works well with staff, peers, and members of the public to remove barriers, problem solve and improve the way the work gets done.
- 4. Nominee demonstrates excellent situational awareness, often self-correcting or seeking additional training or direction from staff.

Criteria: Collaboration VALUE: STEWARDSHIP

Nominee exemplifies collaboration and cooperation.

- 1. Nominee led or encouraged cooperation and collaboration, working with others to achieve a shared goal -- sharing knowledge, learning and building consensus.
- 2. Nominee consistently offered support, assistance and encouragement to peers, often without being asked to do so.
- 3. Nominee served as role model to others through positive and productive relationships with staff.
- 4. Nominee is proactive and upfront, and readily offers constructive feedback to staff when differences, issues or problems arise.
