Marion County's handy-dandy online recycling database, aka the *Recycing & Disposal Guide* just got even handier to those of you on the go. The formatting of the database was recently updated to allow for easy reading on smart phones.

It still allows you to search for locations to take practically everything under the sun, as well as find out what materials each location listed in our database can accept, but now you can do it wherever you happen to be when that burning question: "What I am going to do with *this*?" pops into your head.

If you are searching on a standard computer it will look the same as it always has. The database can detect if it is being accessed with a smart phone and automatically resizes the screen to fit.

Keep your eyes out for future streamlining of

access to this useful tool, starting by using a consistent name for it on our web pages and linking to it from all of the Environmental Services pages.

More than 20% of Marion County residents are Latino, and the Waste Reduction program has long been making efforts to make sure this segment of our population is well-informed about waste-reduction and recycling strategies and opportunities. With the launching of a Spanish version of our website, www.mcrecicla.net, our efforts just got a huge boost! Most of the thanks goes to our part-time assistant, Griselda Puga.

In addition to translating many of our printed materials, Griselda has been hard at work translating many of the key web pages to Spanish; the pages were officially launched in late

March. Spanish-speaking residents can now look up information on recycling, composting, EarthWISE, multifamily recycling and disposal.

This will allow better integration of our print, tv, and radio presence with easy access to complete information on many of our programs.

The web pages are not a page-for-page mirror of the English language site, but the hope is to continue to expand it as time and resources allow.



Funding opportunity!

Do you have an idea that could reduce waste in Marion County but lack the funding to implement it? The Marion County Waste Reduction Grant Program may be able to help!

The program uses funds set aside from out-of-county medical waste disposal fees.



The objectives of the program are to:

- Reduce the amount of waste generated in Marion County.
- Reduce the amount of waste disposed of at Marion County disposal facilities.
- Encourage the development of products made from recovered materials from Marion County, markets for those materials, and the use of products containing recycled materials.

Two types of proposals will be considered: waste reduction projects that directly reduce waste, and promotion and education programs.

For the Spring 2012offering, a possible \$100,000 in grants is available through the program. Individuals, companies, governments and non-profit organizations are eligible to apply. Application deadline is May 31, 2012. Visit mcrecycles.net for complete details.


