Marion County Aims to Increase Recycling Opportunities at Apartments

Marion County is rolling out a new pilot program which aims to determine the best methods of increasing recycling rates at multi-family housing units in Marion County.

The pilot project will work with 20 apartment complexes in Salem. The program will distribute recycling containers (a bin or tote bag) to some apartment complexes and educational information to all of the apartment complexes. Each apartment complex will be monitored for increased recycling rates and contamination rates and pilot project participants will be surveyed to determine the effectiveness of the materials they received. Results of the pilot program will determine whether apartment complexes throughout Marion County will receive recycling tote bags, recycling bins, or neither.

Keep this pilot program in mind as you are out and about volunteering at events this summer. Although the management at all of the apartment complexes in the pilot program have agreed to be a participant in the program, and educational materials about the project were distributed to every unit, some residents may still come up to you wondering why they received a recycling bin or tote for use inside their home. Do your best to explain the pilot program to these residents, and encourage them to fill out the survey they'll be re-

ceiving.

In Marion County, 23.5 percent of the housing units are in multi-family complexes and almost 79,000 people live in those complexes. Recycling at apartment complexes has some unique challenges, and the financial benefit of recycling (or just produc-

ing less waste) isn't passed along to apartment renters who don't pay their trash bill.
