# Is Your Home Energy Efficient?

One of the best ways to check if your home is using energy wisely is to complete an **energy audit**. Answer the questions below and tally up your points!

### 1. Refrigerator

Close your fridge door over a piece of paper so it's half in and half out of the fridge. Try

and pull the paper out. Is it:

Easy to pull out (1 pt)

Hard to pull out (2 pts)

Doesn't pull out (4 pts)

## 2. Furnace Filters

Ask your parent how often your home's furnace filters were cleaned or changed in the last year. How many times?

0 times (0 pts)

- **1**-3 times (2 pts)
- **4** + times (4 pts)

## 3. Light Bulbs

Count how many LED light bulbs you have in your home. Do you have:

0 LED bulbs (0 pts)

- 1-4 LED bulbs (2 pts)
- **5** + LED bulbs (4 pts)



#### 4. Thermostat

This winter, your home's thermostat was set to what temperature:

**7**4 degrees or higher (0 pt)

- **71-73** degrees (2 pts)
- **7**0 degrees or lower (4 pts)

#### 5. Insulation

Ask an adult for help measuring how thick the insulation in your attic is. Is it:

- 6 inches or fewer (1 pt)
- **7**-11 inches (2 pts)
- 12 inches or more (4 pts)

## 6. Windows

What kind of windows do you have at home?

Single-pane windows (0 pts)

- Double-pane windows (2 pts)
- Double-pane, gas-filled or reflective coating (4 pts)

#### How did you do?

**21-28 Points: Congratulations!** Your home is energy efficient.

13-20 Points: You're getting there! Are there ways you could improve your score?

**3-12 Points: Your home isn't very efficient.** Look for ways to increase your home's efficiency. Your parents could contact the Oregon Department of Energy to learn about programs that can save your home's energy!
