NOTICE OF DECISION CONDITIONAL USE CASE NO. 19-012

<u>APPLICATION</u>: Application of Leo Dibala for a conditional use to place a temporary mobile home for medical hardship purposes on a 1.19 acre property in a SA (Special Agriculture) zone located at 11815 Riverhaven Lane SE, Stayton (T9S; R1E; Section 14DC; tax lot 100).

<u>DECISION</u>: The Planning Director for Marion County has **APPROVED** the above-described Conditional Use application subject to certain conditions.

EXPIRATION DATE: This conditional use permit is valid only when exercised by **May 13, 2021**. The effective period may be extended for an additional year subject to approval of an extension (form available from the Planning Division). **Additional extensions may not be granted if the regulations under which this decision was granted have changed since the original approval.**

<u>RENEWAL</u>: This permit may be renewed for successive one year periods if the applicant submits to the Planning Division, <u>on an annual basis</u>, a new Physician's Certificate which indicates that the hardship situation continues. The Planning Division will mail renewal forms to the property owner approximately two months prior to permit expiration.

WARNING: A decision approving the proposal is for land use purposes only. Due to septic, well, and drain field replacement areas, this parcel may not be able to support the proposal. To ensure the subject property can accommodate the proposed use the applicant should contact the Building Inspection Division at (503) 588-5147.

This decision does not include approval of a building permit.

CONDITIONS: The following conditions must be met <u>before a building permit can be obtained or the approved use</u> established:

- 1. The applicant shall obtain all required permits from the Marion County Building Inspection Division.
- 2. The applicant shall submit a Manufactured Home Removal or Disconnect Agreement (enclosed) to the Planning Division. This agreement specifies that placement of the manufactured home is temporary and will be removed or disconnected and no longer used for residential purposes after the hardship ceases.
- 3. The applicant shall sign and submit a Farm/Forest Declaratory Statement (enclosed) to the Planning Division. This statement shall be recorded by the applicant with the Marion County Clerk after it has been reviewed and signed by the Planning Director.

ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS: Once the approved use is established the following conditions must be continually satisfied:

- 4. The proposed manufactured home shall use the existing septic system if feasible.
- 5. The manufactured home shall be located as shown on the applicant's site plan.
- 6. The manufactured home shall be located as indicated in the applicant's statement and shall maintain 20-foot setbacks from the property lines proposed by Property Line Adjustment Case #18-040.
- 7. Prior to obtaining a building permit for placement of a manufactured home for the hardship, the applicant must meet the conditions of approval in Floodplain Development Permit Case #19-002.

8. The applicants are advised that this permit is granted for a period of one year <u>and must be renewed</u> for successive one year periods upon submittal of a Physician's Certificate for Leo Dibala, verifying that the hardship conditions continue to exist. In addition, every five years the Marion County Building Inspection Division requires a septic evaluation for shared systems prior to renewal of hardship conditional uses.

OTHER PERMITS, FEES, AND RESTRICTIONS: This approval does not remove or affect covenants or restrictions imposed on the subject property by deed or other instrument. The proposed use may require permits and/or fees from other local, State or Federal agencies. This decision does not take the place of, or relieve the responsibility for, obtaining other permits or satisfying restrictions or conditions. It is recommended agencies mentioned in Finding #6 below be contacted to identify restrictions or necessary permits. The applicant is advised of the following:

9. The applicants should contact the Stayton Fire District to obtain a copy of the District's Recommended Building Access and Premise Identification regulations and the Marion County Fire Code Applications Guide. Fire District access standards may be more restrictive than County standards.

<u>APPEAL PROCEDURE</u>: The Marion County Zone Code provides that certain applications be considered first by the County Planning Director. If there is any doubt that the application conforms with adopted land use policies and regulations the Director must condition or deny the application. Anyone who disagrees with the Director's decision may request that the application be considered by a Marion County hearings officer after a public hearing. The applicant may also request reconsideration (one time only and a fee of \$200) on the basis of new information subject to signing an extension of the 150 day time limit for review of zoning applications.

A public hearing is held on appeals subject to the appellant paying a \$250.00 fee. Requests for reconsideration, or consideration by a hearings officer, must be in writing (form available from the Planning Division) and received in the Marion County Planning Division, 5155 Silverton Rd. NE, Salem, by 5:00 p.m. on May 13, 2019. If you have questions about this decision contact the Planning Division at (503) 588-5038 or at the office. This decision is effective May 14, 2019 unless further consideration is requested.

FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS: Findings and conclusions on which the decision was based are noted below.

- 1. The subject property is designated Special Agriculture in the Marion County Comprehensive Plan. The major purpose of this designation and the corresponding SA (Special Agriculture) zone is to promote the continuation of commercial agricultural and forestry operations. The subject property is located within the identified 100-year floodplain of the North Santiam River. A temporary manufactured dwelling under hardship conditions may be approved as a conditional use provided the need is justified and the residence will not have a detrimental impact upon the existing or potential farming and timber activity in the area.
- 2. The subject property is located in the 11800 block of Riverhaven Lane SE, Stayton. The property contains a dwelling, accessory buildings, well, and septic system. The property was the subject of Property Line Adjustment Case #18-040 which approved a reconfiguration of this property with its neighboring property. The property was also the subject of Floodplain Development Permit Case #19-002 which approved the replacement of a dwelling in the 100-year floodplain. In lieu of a replacement dwelling, the floodplain development approval can be considered for approval of the hardship dwelling. The parcel is considered a legal lot for land use purposes.
- 3. Surrounding lands consist of properties being farmed, native stands of timber, and rural homesites in an SA (Special Agriculture) zone.
- 4. <u>Soil Survey for Marion County, Oregon</u> indicates 98% of the subject property is comprised of high-value soils.
- 5. A signed Physician's Certificate has been submitted for Leo Dibala, indicating he has medical conditions that preclude him from maintaining a complete separate and detached dwelling apart from his family.
- 6. <u>Marion County Building Inspection</u> commented that a building permit is required for new construction or placement of a manufactured home.

<u>Marion County Building Inspection Onsite Wastewater Specialist</u> commented that connection of the hardship dwelling requires septic authorization. Contact at (503) 588-5147 for more information.

All other commenting agencies stated no objection to the proposal.

- 7. In order to approve a manufactured home under hardship the applicant must demonstrate compliance with the specific criteria listed in MCC 17.120.040. These include:
 - (a) For the purposes of this subsection "hardship" means a medical hardship or hardship for the care of an aged or infirm person or persons.
 - (b) A doctor of medicine or licensed psychologist shall sign a statement indicating the physical or mental condition that prevents the person(s) with the hardship from providing the basic self care needed to live on a separate lot. The statement shall also attest that the physician or licensed psychologist is convinced the person(s) with the hardship must be provided the care so frequently or in such a manner that the caretaker must reside on the same premises.
 - (c) Those providing the needed assistance shall be related by blood, marriage or legal guardianship and reside in another residence on the property. If evidence is presented that there is no family member able to provide the needed care the caretaker may be someone else provided the property is located in a zone other than the EFU, SA, FT or TC zones. In the EFU, SA, FT and TC zones, occupancy of the hardship mobile home or recreational vehicle is limited to the term of the hardship suffered by the existing resident or a relative as defined in ORS 215.283.
 - (d) Those providing the care must show that they will be available and have the skills to provide the primary care required by the doctor or psychologist.
 - (e) One of the residences shall be removed from the property within 90 days of the date the person(s) with the hardship or the care provider no longer reside on the property. In the case of a recreational vehicle it shall be rendered uninhabitable by disconnection from services. An agreement to comply with this requirement shall be signed by the property owner and the care providers. Oregon Department of Environmental Quality removal requirements also apply.
 - (f) The manufactured home or recreational vehicle shall to the extent permitted by the nature of the property and existing development:
 - (1) Be located as near as possible to other residences on the property;
 - (2) On EFU, SA, FT and TC zoned property, be located on the portion of the property that is least suitable for farm or forest use, if it is not feasible to locate it near an existing residence;
 - (3) Not require new driveway access to the street;
 - (4) Be connected to the existing wastewater disposal system if feasible. The disposal system shall be approved by the county sanitarian.
 - (g) The use is intended to be temporary, shall be subject to review every year, and shall continue to meet the above criteria in order to qualify for renewal.
- 8. Based on the available evidence, including a signed Physician's Certificate, Leo Dibala's physical circumstances constitute a hardship condition relating to the aged, the infirm, or persons otherwise incapable of maintaining a complete, separate and detached residence apart from family. Leo Dibala will live in the existing dwelling on the subject property. Leo Dibala's daughter, Lisa Youngstrom, will live in the proposed hardship dwelling and provide the assistance he needs. The evidence also indicates the proposed hardship dwelling will be relatively temporary in nature. The requirement that a Manufactured Home Removal or Disconnect Agreement be filed by the applicant ensures that the manufactured home will be removed from the property and will no longer be used for residential purposes when the hardship ceases. For these reasons, the applicant's proposal satisfies the criteria #7(a), (b), (c), and (d). The criteria #7(e) and (g) can be made a condition of any approval.
- 9. The entire property is zoned SA and the proposed location of the hardship dwelling is near the road in an area that has been cleared and is not farmed. The proposed hardship dwelling will share a driveway with the main dwelling and have its own septic system if feasible. The hardship dwelling will be located in close proximity to the main dwelling. Based on the applicant's submitted site plan, existing structures and development of the property, this appears to be as close as possible to the existing residence. For these reasons, the proposal meets the criteria #7(f).

- 10. Since the property is located in an SA zone, the proposal must also satisfy the conditional use criteria in MCC 17.137.060(A). Those requirements are:
 - (a) The use will not force a significant change in, or significantly increase the cost of, accepted farm or forest practices on surrounding lands devoted to farm or forest use. Land devoted to farm or forest use does not include farm or forest use on lots or parcels upon which a non-farm or non-forest dwelling has been approved and established, in exception areas approved under ORS 197.732, or in an acknowledged urban growth boundary.
 - (b) Adequate fire protection and other rural services are, or will be, available when the use is established.
 - (c) The use will not have a significant adverse impact on watersheds, groundwater, fish and wildlife habitat, soil and slope stability, air and water quality.
 - (d) Any noise associated with the use will not have a significant adverse impact on nearby land uses.
 - (e) The use will not have a significant adverse impact on potential water impoundments identified in the Comprehensive Plan, and not create significant conflicts with operations included in the Comprehensive Plan inventory of significant mineral and aggregate sites.
- 11. The proposal will allow the placement of a temporary manufactured home on the property. There is no evidence to indicate that the temporary dwelling will have any adverse effects on surrounding properties in farm use. In addition, the County requires that a Farm/Forest Declaratory Statement be recorded with the property deed acknowledging the property is in a resource zone and may be affected by nearby farming and forestry uses. Because the use is residential in nature, there is no evidence to indicate that the temporary dwelling will significantly increase traffic on area roads. Fire protection is provided by the Stayton Fire District and the Marion County Sheriff provides policing. Other rural services, such as well and septic, are available on the property. Due to the temporary and residential nature of the use, the placement of a manufactured home will not have a significant adverse impact on watersheds, groundwater, fish and wildlife habitat, soil and slope stability, air and water quality, create a significant amount of noise, impact potential water impoundments or conflict with mineral and aggregate sites. For these reasons, the proposal satisfies the criteria #10 (a), (b), (c), (d) and (e).
- 12. Based on the above findings, it has been determined that the request meets all applicable criteria for placing a temporary manufactured home for medical hardship purposes and is, therefore, **APPROVED**.
