Forestland Special Assessment General Information

Marion County Assessor's Office (updated March 2024)

Oregon law provides for this special assessment under Oregon Revised Statute 321 and Oregon Administrative Rule 150-321-0340 which sets down requirements for designation. These requirements fall into three categories:

1. MINIMUM AREA FOR DESIGNATION

Designated Forestland - The area to be designated must have at least **two contiguous acres of trees** in one ownership.

Small Tract Forestland - The area to be designated must meet the Designated Forestland minimum in addition to having at least ten acres of trees in one ownership.

2. <u>SPECIES LIMITED TO MARKETABLE SPECIES</u>

Marketable species means a species of tree that meets the following criteria (OAR 629-610-0050):

- Is ecologically suited to the planting site;
- The species must be capable of producing logs, fiber, or other wood products suitable in size and quality for the production of lumber, sheeting, pulp or other commercial forest products; **and**
- Must be marketable in the foreseeable future.

3. STOCKING REQUIREMENTS

Typically, for Marion County, you must have **200 seedlings** minimum per acre. Contact Oregon Department of Forestry at <u>https://www.oregon.gov/odf/Pages/index.aspx</u> or (503) 945-7200 for more information.

Planting a new forest.

Step 1: Planning

Planning to reforest your property should take place before harvest begins. Site conditions will determine which seedling species and seedling size to order.



Step 2: Ordering

Order seedlings no later than the fall before planting season. Select the proper seedling, species, seed zone, and size for each site. Douglas-fir (western Oregon) and ponderosa pine (eastern Oregon) are common species, but there is a lot of variation. Please contact your local ODF office for information specific to your site.

Step 3: *Planting*

Once the site is prepared and the seedlings have been ordered, planting can take place from December through March (later for snow-bound sites). Proper handling of seedlings from the nursery through planting is critical, as is the planting technique. **Plant more than the minimum number of trees per acre to allow for seedling losses**.

Reforestation Crews can be hired to reforest your property. Contact your local ODF office for a list of local crews.



Step 4: Maintaining

Inspect the seedlings each year to ensure that they are alive and are free-to-grow. Vegetation control and additional tree planting may be necessary for the next 5 years.
