## Review of proposed Turner Downtown Urban Renewal Plan

Summary of Presentation:

- The Turner Downtown Improvement Plan is a 27 year plan for future growth and improvement of the approximately 79.41 acres;
- Currently considering the adoption of an ordinance to establish an urban renewal area;
- The tax increment revenues would assist with transportation, infrastructure, economic development, public safety, fire hydrants, sidewalks, planters, event center, and a museum;
- The proposed maximum indebtedness, the limit on the amount of funds that may be spent on administration, projects and programs is \$5,000,000; and
- Marion County portion predicated on new growth

#### Board Discussion:

- Current reserves would allow for moving ahead on the plan;
- Open house was very good with property owners wanting something to happen;
- Mr. Sawyer was reminded of the County Community Grants that will become available;

# Update on the implementation of garnishments as a tool for collection

Summary of Presentation:

- Marion County currently uses an outside collection agency, Professional Credit Services (PCS), for receivable balances;
- Finance is requesting the use of the garnishment process to improve the rate of collection;
- PCS is used by other jurisdictions including:
  - o Washington, Clackamas, Lane, Deschutes, and Jackson Counties;
  - o City of Salem, Eugene, Springfield, and Roseburg; and
  - ODOT, Oregon Employment Dept. and Department of environmental Quality.
- Estimated increase in collections with garnishments is approximately 10 percent;
- The intended process would be county-wide; and

• Each department pursues payment and then turns the uncollected portions over to Finance to pursue payment.

#### Board Discussion:

- Service District rides all year until they apply it to property taxes;
- Need to have discussion with Parole and Probation and the Sheriff's Office:
  - Jeff White to attend Community Corrections Board in the morning for discussion.
- Move forward with Justice Courts:
  - Judge Zyryanoff works with each person for payment and garnishments can be pulled back; and
  - o Probation Officers could be educated to the court process for paying fines.

#### **Commissioners Committee Assignments and Update**

  - o Reviewing budgets including NW Senior & Disabilities.
- Commissioner Cameron visited:
  - o Wheatland Ferry. Approximately 100 cars per day travel this ferry.
