


Official Marion County Ballot Drop Sites & Instructions for Voting Your Ballot

The only outside **Drive-thru** ballot drop site is located in the 500 Block of Court Street, on the north side of the Marion County Courthouse.

Drive-thru Open:

Monday, January 25th and Tuesday, January 26h from 6:00 AM to 7:00 PM *



* Tuesday, January 26th the drive-thru will close at 7:00 PM, however, the walk-in ballot drop site located in the Courthouse Lobby will remain open until 8:00 PM.

All Marion County Drop Sites are open normal business hours beginning on January 11th and will remain open Election Day, January 26th, 2010 until 8:00 PM.

Instructions for Voting Your Ballot & Official Marion County Ballot Drop Sites



Notify Marion County Elections <u>BEFORE</u> voting the ballot delivered to you if:

- Your name is different than that on the label; or
- Your residence address has changed; or
- You have added, deleted or changed a mailing address.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR VOTING

To make sure your vote counts:

- <u>DO NOT</u> use a felt tip pen to mark your ballot. Use a pencil or black ballpoint ink pen.
- Mark the arrow LIKE THIS:
- Vote the ballot on a hard surface.
- To vote for a measure, complete the arrow pointing to the "YES" or "NO".

REVIEW THE BALLOT PACKET

It should contain the following items:

- A Printed ballot
- A Secrecy envelope
- A Pre-addressed return envelope
- This Informational Insert

CHECK YOUR BALLOT

- Make sure you have completely filled in the arrow(s) next to your choice(s).
- If you vote **both** "YES" **and** "NO" on a measure, it is called an Overvote. Your vote will not count for that measure
- You do not have to vote on all contests. Those you do vote on will still count.

RETURNING YOUR VOTED BALLOT

- Place the ballot in the secrecy envelope, seal it, then place the secrecy envelope in the Return envelope. Do not remove labels, if any.
- Sign the Voter Statement on the back of the Return envelope. Your ballot will not be counted if <u>you</u> do not sign <u>your</u> envelope.
- To return your ballot by mail, place **one first class stamp** on the Return envelope.
- To return your ballot other than through the mail, please refer to the list of <u>ballot drop sites</u> on the other side. You may return your ballot to any Official Ballot Drop Site in Oregon.

If you have a disability or are otherwise unable to mark your ballot please contact the Marion County Elections Division.

FOR YOUR BALLOT TO BE COUNTED

- Mark your ballot according to voting instructions.
- Do **NOT** remove any label(s).
- Use your secrecy envelope.
- Your Return ballot envelope **must be signed**.
- Your ballot must be received in the Elections Office or an Official Ballot Drop Site by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day,

January 26th. *POSTMARK DOES NOT COUNT.*
