## Miscellaneous Takeaway Points for 2020

- In 1 suicide case, a positive COVID diagnosis was a factor
- While we saw an increase in suicides for 2020, in relation to the amount of cases we investigated, there was no increase in suicide deaths for 2020
- COVID was a contributing factor in 2 accidental falls
- With the addition of 131 COVID positive cases reported to the office in 2020, we still had an increase of 239 total cases (+108) from last year, a total increase of 262 reported cases since 2017
- For the fourth year in a row, Meth/amphetamines are the most common drug used in all drug related deaths
- For the fourth year in a row, falls are the most common cause of accidental deaths
- Accidental deaths were the most common manner of death investigated
- Saw an increase in deaths associated with fentanyl intoxication in 2020
