10:00-10:05	Call To Order January 2019 Meeting Minutes	Minutes approved for January 2019 meeting.
10:05-10:15	Emergency Preparedness Exercise	<p>The Emergency Preparedness Exercise at Corban University had 55 attendees: 40 attendees were from health care organizations and 5 were from private sector nonprofits. Some felt the exercise was too focused on the Salem/Keizer water incident.</p> <p>Internal capacity and gaps were examined along with overlapping capabilities.</p> <p>There will be a state wide exercise in April that will focus on Anthrax.</p>

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10:15-10:50	System QI Initiatives: A. Hospital Times B. Naloxone Mapping	<p>QI met in February to discuss Narcan/Naloxen. Community Law Enforcement Agencies (LEA) that have started using Narcan, have had several successes with saving potential fatal over doses.</p> <p>There is a mapping system (ODMAP) that maps over doses across the U.S. This seems like a useful tool for LEA and EMS to use in our community. The system is easy to use and the Oregon/Idaho Director, Chris Gibson is local and available to come speak more about the system and its benefits. The mapping system can track spikes in over doses that can single a “bad batch” is headed towards the community. This is a system wide approach to this issue that will impact the individuals ASA serves.</p> <p>There may be a statewide committee forming to look at long wait times across the state. It will be important to make sure we use the same language and key points.</p> <p>At SH there has been a recent spike in wait time at the ED. From the data ASA has collected 2018 /2019 January wait times look the</p>
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		<p>same, but percentages are up. SH increased staff by 110 % in ED, but there are not rooms to put the patients, so the wait times do not improve. SH is working on a surge plan. SH brought their own data to the last meeting and their data matched up to ASA wait time data. Their new building won't be up until 2022.</p> <p>There was a lockdown at SH and there was no communication with EMS. There needs to be a procedure in place when SH is in lock down. There are concerns if AS creates their own divert plan.</p> <p>Moving forward:</p> <p>The analysis of drop times falls under the QI parameters.</p> <p>Finding a uniform protocol fits within ASA committee parameters.</p>
