- CCO Update
 - o Willamette Valley Community Health is the Local CCO
 - Operating in Marion and Polk
 - 13 founding member
 - 1 Commissioner from each county
 - 11 providers that contributed money
 - About 61,000 members that are currently covered
 - o Completed 5 months that there is data. Started August 1st
 - Financially things are on track budget wise
 - Financial requirements increase as the CCO continues
 - Financial Health is a concern
 - Focusing the first target on top utilzers of the ER
 - Non Traditional Health care workers will be connected to the high utilizers
 - They will help people get connected with services
 - They will help them engage in services and improve their care
 - o Working on the issue of prescription of opiates
 - Looking at what is a reasonable prescription
 - Looking at what quantity there should be a second look a the prescription to make sure it is appropriate

- Addition of Behaviorist for mental health and A & D Care inside the PCP's office
 - Brief screenings and treatment (up to 3 visits)
 - Help with getting outside care for mental health and Chemical Dependency
 - Also there to help with accepting the patient back from the Mental Health or Chemical Dependency
- o In the process of negotiation new contracts that will be ready April 1st.
 - They will be more risk based contracts
- o Polk County
 - Is taking back the direct care of all of their members for mental health that live in Polk
 - Looking to expand their West Salem Clinic
