

Name: Japanese and Giant knotweed (Polygonum cuspidatum syn. Fallopia cuspidatum, P. sachalinense)

Aliases: monkeyweed, elephant ear, fleece flower

Description: Leaf size: Japanese 4" to 6" long, Giant 10" to 12" long, produce small white-green flowers in clusters that droop from the leaf axis, Stems are red-brown, stout, hollow, and swollen at the nodes like bamboo

Last seen: Stream banks, moist places, roadsides, neglected gardens

Charge: Reducing biodiversity by crowding out native and beneficial plant species, clogging small waterways
