City/Special District Addenda

In the fall of 2006, OPDR at the University of Oregon's Community Service Center partnered with Oregon Emergency Management (OEM) to develop a Pre-Disaster Mitigation Planning Grant proposal to create natural hazards mitigation plan addenda for Oregon's Mid/Southern Willamette Valley cities. FEMA awarded the region with a Pre-Disaster Mitigation planning grant, and planning efforts with the cities of Aurora, Keizer, Silverton, and Woodburn began in the winter of 2009. The Partnership facilitated and documented each of the cities' planning processes. This volume (Volume III) of the Marion County Multi-Jurisdictional NHMP incorporates those addenda by reference³²⁰ and identifies updates thereto.

The referenced addenda are specifically identified as follows:

- *City of Aurora Addendum to the Marion County Natural Hazards Mitigation Plan, Adopted December 4, 2009*
- *City of Keizer Addendum to the Marion County Natural Hazards Mitigation Plan, Adopted December 30, 2009*
- *City of Silverton Addendum to the Marion County Natural Hazards Mitigation Plan, Adopted January 8, 2010*
- *City of Woodburn Addendum to the Marion County Natural Hazards Mitigation Plan, Adopted April 8, 2010*

To coordinate planning efforts, the steering committees from Aurora, Keizer, Silverton, and Woodburn participated in joint meetings facilitated by OPDR. OPDR designed the planning process to: (1) result in addenda that are Disaster Mitigation Act 2000 compliant; (2) coordinate with the state's plan and activities of OPDR; and (3) build a network of local organizations that can play an active role in plan implementation. The specific plan development processes, including the steering committee makeup and public outreach strategy for each city, are documented in Section I of the respective city addenda; the process descriptions are incorporated herein by reference.

Because each of the city addenda were adopted as the county update process was getting under way, the cities determined that re-opening the planning process was neither feasible (due to resources) or desirable (implementation being the priority). Representatives in each of the four cities were

encouraged to participate in the County's plan update process. The county provided notice of the plan update process to the public and invited public comment on the draft plan. Due to funding availability, local resource constraints, staffing changes, local desires/priorities or a combination thereof, extensive re-hashing of the city addenda at the local level was not possible.

The following city Appendix sections describe necessary edits to the city plans based on new information contained in the updated Marion County NHMP. These Appendices will be adopted and incorporated in each of the city addenda following pre-approval by FEMA.
