

# **ESF 12** **Energy**

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## **1 Introduction: Purpose and Scope**

Emergency Support Function 12 is responsible for the restoration of damaged energy utility infrastructure and accompanying systems within the County following a disaster. Also considered in this ESF is the provision of temporary emergency power generation capabilities to support critical facilities until permanent restoration is accomplished. All forms of energy production and transmission and its associated infrastructure should be considered, including electrical, natural gas, petroleum products, hydroelectric, wind, etc. Critical facilities may include primary and alternate ECCs, hospitals/critical care facilities, designated shelters, AOCs (if applicable), government offices/facilities, water/sewage systems, and other essential community services.
