CONFIDENTIALITY:

The County's enforcement-related confidentiality policy is based on State of Oregon public records statutes. Enforcement records are public records but the name of the complainant is exempt from disclosure. The exemption is entitled: "Information submitted to a public body in confidence." As such, any record that identifies a complainant is exempt from disclosure. However, notes in a file or a complaint letter that does not specifically identify the complainant may be disclosed. The County will disclose the complainant's name if that person is going to be a witness in an enforcement case – the "right of cross examination" requires this provision.
